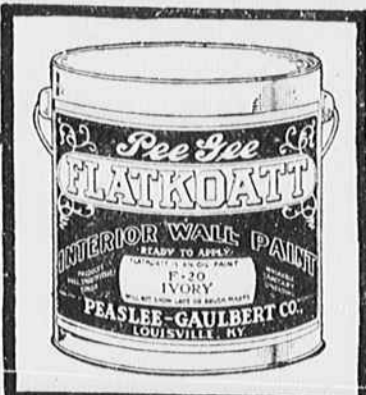

BIG WAR-DOGS SAILED ON FRIDAY

Nine Monster Battleships to Make Tour of the World, Carrying Greetings from the New to the Old.

Hampton Roads, Va., Oct. 25.—Bearing the greetings of the new world to the old, the great sea fighters of the Atlantic fleet were today started on their way to the ports of the sunny Mediterranean. Nine sombre-garbed war machines carrying thousands of American fighting men and sailormen, received the final nod of farewell from the trim yacht Dolphin, bearing Assistant Secretary of the Navy Franklin D. Roosevelt, and slid slowly out between the protect-saps into the open sea—the course due east.

As the creeping gray forms melted into the shadows of the horizon the crackling wireless flashed the last word from the assistant secretary of the navy, acting as representative of the president, commander-in-chief of the navy.

"In sending you as representatives of the United States navy of today, we hope to show to the old world that the achievements and traditions of the past are being sustained and carried forward to a still more splendid future. Good luck, and God-speed."

Will Reflect Honor.
"The fleet thanks you for your parting words and will do its utmost to reflect honor upon the country and the service."

In battle formation the ponderous grey shapes slid by the trim little yacht, laying to just inside the capes. Straight down the channel, grey bulk after grey bulk, crept by, the crows lining the rail at quarters, marines and bands on parade. First came the big Wyoming, America's latest word in war craft, her bow sliding through the water, upturning a sheaf of farm. At her masthead fluttered the blue double-tarred flag of the commanding rear admiral. But two ship lengths behind, and directly in her wake, the Arkansas, flagship of the first division, under Rear Admiral Mameron McR. Winslow, stole along. Then at exact intervals followed the Utah, Florida, the Delaware, the Kansas, the Vermont and Ohio. In their wake signalling "engine trouble," limped the Connecticut. Rear Admiral Frank E. Beattie's flagship, flags out announcing her "out of position." At last the little sea tug Sonora scurried by and the fleet was on its way. A few miles out the supply ships and colliers with the hospital ship Solace, which had steamed out of the roads ahead of the formal review, awaited the fleet's coming.

Day of Leave Taking.
The fleet headed to open sea after a day of leave taking and naval ceremonial. Assistant Secretary Roosevelt in the Dolphin reached the roads in the early morning. A swarm of launches and whaleboats scurried about over the quiet waters, hurrying the laggards of the "shore watch" in ship, carry wives and sweethearts out to the big ship soon to take their loved ones down to the sea, getting the last shore mail aboard, and generally getting the fleet shipshape for the cruise. From the dawn until noon the little boats darted here and there among the giant steel war vessels that swung in double column across the fairway.

Shortly after the Dolphin arrived and was given its salute by the flagships. Assistant Secretary Roosevelt received the admirals commanding the vessels of the fleet, in his cabin with the full ceremonial of naval visits at sea, blaring trumpets, booming cannon, and band playing. Rear Admiral Badger came first, then Rear Admiral Winslow and Beattie. After they had paid their respects, Rear Admiral Clifford J. Boush, commanding the third division of the Atlantic fleet, came aboard from the Rhode Island. The Rhode Island and the other ships of the third division of the Atlantic fleet are under orders to leave for the coast of Mexico next week.

Distinguished Party.
Just as the admirals left for their ships a driving rain which had drenched the fleet all night and morning, ceased, and the sun broke through the heavy clouds to grace the farewell ceremonies. To Admiral Badger's flagship, the Wyoming, the division flagships and to the Rhode Island, Secretary Roosevelt and his official party paid a return visit with all the formalities. With the secretary were Assistant Secretary of War Henry T. Brockbridge, Assistant Secretary of State John E. Osborn, Assistant Attorney General Samuel J. Graham, John Burke, treasurer of the United States; Commissioner of Corporations Joseph E. Davies, and Senator Brandegee, of Connecticut.

MEMORIAL SHAFT ERECTION BEGUN

Partisan Monument to be Unveiled November 11. Ruckstuhl Designer.

Columbia, Oct. 24.—The D. A. R. monument to the partisan generals, Marion, Sumter and Pickens, arrived in Columbia in various sections yesterday and the first work was done towards its erection on the State capitol grounds. J. P. Hummel of the Davis Granite company of New York is in charge of the work. Mr. Hummel placed the 13 Wisconsin monuments and the seven Wisconsin markers for the government in the National cemetery at Vicksburg, Miss., and he brings with him for inspection of the D. A. R. committee, testimonials from William T. Rigby, chairman of the Vicksburg National Park commission.

To Face Sumter Street.
Yesterday the excavation for the foundation of the monument was dug, the centre being in a direct line with the centre of the front of Trinity church and about eight feet from the pavement (Sumter street), the monument to face Sumter street. The hole which is 6 feet square by 4 deep will be filled with cement and into this the base will be sunk.

The monument is all-Southern as far as the granite part of it is concerned, the shaft is of red Missouri granite and the base and the Roman seats surrounding it are of finest South Carolina granite from the Fairfield quarry. The shaft was cut by the Davis Granite company at their Massachusetts quarry; the figure of Victory, which will surmount it, was designed by P. Wellington Ruckstuhl, modelled at his Paris studio and cast in Paris.

The monument from the ground to the top of the head of the figure will measure 27 feet, the wings extending a little above that. The figure itself is five feet tall, having the wings and arms outspread, one hand holding a palm branch and the other a laurel wreath.

Sculptor is Coming.
The concrete platform upon which the monument will stand will be 23 feet square and will be pebbled in white with a dark pebbled border having one end rounded. Mr. Hummel says that he was unable to find suitable pebbles in or near Columbia and has ordered them shipped immediately from the North. A turfed embankment around the base will be surrounded by a bronze fence one foot high placed upon a coping of Fairfield granite. Three massive Roman benches of Fairfield granite will give a handsome finish to the memorial shaft.

The date of the unveiling is November 11, the first day of the annual D. A. R. convention which convenes that night. Mr. Ruckstuhl will arrive in Columbia Nov. 8 to inspect the work, give his personal supervision to the finishing touches and see that all is well before the monument is turned over to the D. A. R. committee. The State.
