ADOLPHUS JONES HEADS TAX BOARD

State Commission Named by Governor To Study Problems.

Columbia, Feb. 28.—Gov. Manning yesterday appointed the State tax commission, in accordance with the act of the last general assembly. A. W. Jones, who has served for six terms as comptroller general, resigned that office, and was appointed chairman of the commission. Other members of the commission are W. G. Query of Spartanburg and J. P. Derham of Horry county.

Immediately after the appointment of the commission Gov. Manning announced that he had appointed Charlton W. Sawyer of Orangeburg, for several years chief clerk, as comptroller general of South Carolina, to fill out the unexpired term of Mr. Jones.

The appointments were made under an act of the last general assembly, providing for a commission "to equalize the assessment of all property in this state between persons, firms or corporations of the same assessment district, between cities, towns and townships of the same county, and between different counties of the state, and the property assessed by the said commission in the first instance."

The act also provides for a board of review, consisting of seven members, one from each congressional district, to be appointed by the governor. These appointments have not yet been made by the governor. The assessments and equalizations made by the commission shall be subject to the approval of the board.

The salary of the chairman of the tax commission is \$2,500 a year. He will serve for six years. The two other commissioners will receive a per diem of \$5 and their actual traveling and hotel expenses while engaged in the work of the commission.

The tax commission will have the power and authority and exercise all of the powers hitherto conferred by law upon the State board of equalization and the State board of assessment. These two boards were abolished upon the approval of the tax commission act.

A. W. Jones sent the following letter of resignation to Gov. Manning as comptroller general of South Carolina:

"I desire to express my appreciation of the appointment, tendered me as chairman of the tax commission, and to notify you of my acceptance of the same. I feel that in the present exigency of public affairs, I can there render more valuable service than as comptroller general. I shall endeavor to collaborate with the other members of the commission in the accomplishment of the reforms urged in your inaugural address and endorsed by the general assembly. I do not underestimate the work necessary to achieve these results. This year the work of the commission will be largely examining into values of properties and conferring with the people preparatory to a reassessment of all property in 1916 for the purpose of equalizing the present valuation. The public should know this does not mean an increase of taxes on property, but is only for the purpose of equalization. It would be unwise to increase the valuation until the arbitrary school tax has been made flexible by a constitutional amendment or legislative action. The other reforms must be gradually accomplished."

"Having determined to accept the appointment to the tax commission, I hereby tender you my resignation as comptroller general. In leaving that office I desire to express my appreciation of the efficient service rendered by the clerks in that department. With reference to the pension department I desire to express my appreciation of the efficient service rendered by Miss Maher as clerk of the State pension board during the last 18 years. During this time she has become acquainted with all the cases, and the economical administration of the pension fund is due to her knowledge and tact in dealing with the individual cases, as well as her efficiency in preparing and keeping the records. No other pension fund in the United States is as economically administered and the small salary of \$600 a year which she has received should be increased and made the same as that of other clerks in the comptroller general's office. The fact that she is a woman should not prevent her receiving a man's pay when she does a man's work."

W. G. Query is a member of the Spartanburg delegation in the house. He was appointed this year as a member of the ways and means committee. Mr. Query is a successful farmer, residing at Wellford in Spartanburg county. He served for some time as foreman of the Spartanburg grand jury.

John Pickens Derham is a former comptroller general of South Carolina. He was born in Horry county in April, 1861. He attended the common schools of Horry and the Bingham

school near Asheville. He was appointed school commissioner of Horry county in 1887 and 1888 was county auditor from 1888 to 1891; then elected to the State senate in 1892, and served until 1896. He was elected comptroller general in 1898.

A. W. Jones has been elected comptroller general for seven terms. He is a native of Abbeville county and served for several terms as county auditor. He was first elected comptroller general in 1902. For the past several years Mr. Jones recommended in his annual reports that a State tax commission be created to study the system in this state and make suggestions for changes in the law.—The State.

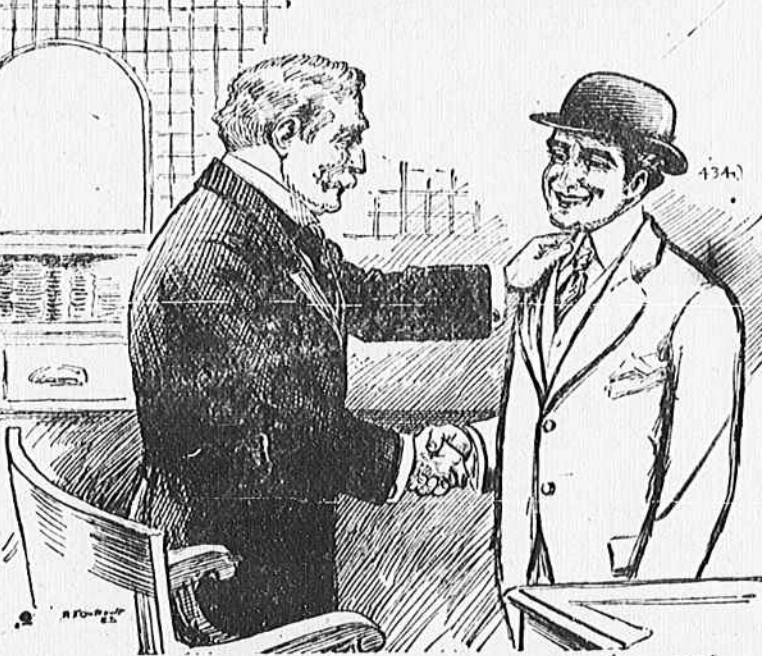
