Microbes That Eat Rubber. If your automobile tires or your rubher boots don't wear so well as they should it may be because microbes are eating them. When perfectly dry commercial rubber is not capable of furnishing nutriment to any form of microbe, but when sufficiently moist it is frequently attacked by certain bacteria or molds which feed on the albuminoids, resins and sugars it contains. The red, yellow, brown and black spots which often appear on rubber are due to the presence of microbes. At least two varieties of microbe are able to assimilate the hydrocarbon of rubber and by so doing destroy its value.
