FELLOW PRISONER ATTACTS LEO FRANK

Deep Gash Made in His Neck, but it is Thought That He Will Live.

Milledgeville, Ga., July 18 .- Leo. M. Frank lay in the Georgia State prison hospital tonight with what attendants said was a fighting chance for recovery. Physicians had succeeded in stopping the flow of blood from a jagged wound in his throat made with an improvised knife in the hands of William Creen, a fellow convict, also serving a life term for murder. The blow was struck as Frank slept in his bunk in a dormitory late last

This latest and most spectacular phase of the two-year fight for Frank's life may be the subject of an invesfigation by the Georgia prison comtence for the murder of Mary Phagan be commuted to life imprisonment. Creen said today when taken from solitary confinement long enough to e questioned, that he planned the atack alone and that no one knew what he intended to do. He was not communicative today and gave as his only youse that "he thought it should be sected his act.

Frank was quartered at night in a dormitory with about 100 other priseners and occupied a bunk about 40 feet from one of the two doors to the large room. Creen's bunk was fourth from his. No prisoner is allowed to leave his place without permission from one of the two guards sationed at the dormitory at night. Shortly after 11 o'clock last night Creen called out for permission to get up and it was granted.

Struck One Blow.

He started down the line of bunks towards the one occupied by Frank, As he reached it he quickly grabbed Frank by the hair and delivered one blow with the knife he had concealed. The attack was witnessed by the guard who rushed to the bunk and prevented Creen from striking again. Creen was a life term for murder,

At 9 o'clock tonight Dr. Compton announced that Frank's temperature was 99 and that his pulse was good. He added that the patient was in no \$48.00. immediate danger.

Patient Doing Well.

This afternoon Dr. Rosenberg of Atlanta, the Frank family physician, arrived here with Mrs. Frank's brother, M. Marcus of Atlanta. Dr. Rosenberg inspected the wound and the dressing and issued a statement late this afternoon that the operation had been a success and that the patient was doing splendidly.

Frank's strong constitution, which was noticeable throughout his fight for life in the courts of Georgia and the higher courts, is still holding out. He was a frail man when he was brought to the State farm, probably 60 pounds lighter than when he was arrested accused of the murder of Mary Phagan. But he has taken on flesh since his arrival here. He was getting strong and robust, working much of the time in the open air with other convicts, hence the great loss of blood that he has suffered has not caused a complete collapse. He is weak, but he has nerve.

Frank has asked the prison doctors again if they thought he would live. "You have a good chance to recover," he was told today.

Forgiving Spirit.

Frank smiled, "Don't punish the man who attacked me," he said. "I have nothing to fear. There is nothing between me and God. I will be able to prove to the world that I am innocent of the crime of which they accuse me."


STUDIED HOME ECONOMICS.
