Turkeys Not Purchased in San Francisco.

San Francisco, Nov. 30.—Between 75,000 and 100,000 pounds of turkey held by local commission merchants, was sent into cold storage today as the result, they said, of a boycott by San Francisco housewives who believed the prevailing price of 35 cents a pound too high. Later yesterday some markets dropped to 28 cents a pound when it became apparent that buyers were maintaining a "hands off" policy toward the Thanksgiving bird.
