SUPPLY ORDINANCE
State of South Carolina,
County of Laurens,
City of Laurens.

AN ORDINANCE
Imposing an annual tax on all taxable property in the City of Laurens for the purpose of raising money to meet the ordinary expenses of the City of Laurens for the fiscal year commencing January 1st, 1917, and to pay the legal obligations of said city, and also to levy and collect a sufficient amount to meet the interest to become due upon the bonded indebtedness of the said city for the year 1917, and to raise a sinking fund for the payment of said bonded indebtedness.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Laurens:

Section 1. That a tax of seventy-five (75) cents on every one hundred dollars' worth of property, real and personal, not exempt by law from taxation, within the corporate limits of the City of Laurens, be and the same is hereby levied for corporate purposes to pay the current expenses of the City of Laurens for the fiscal year, commencing January 1st, 1917, and to meet such other indebtedness as has been legally contracted by said city for corporate purposes: That an additional levy of sixty-five (65) cents on every one hundred dollars worth of the assessed value of all property, real and personal, not exempt from taxation, situate within the corporate limits of the City of Laurens, be and the same is hereby levied, to meet the interest accruing on the bonded indebtedness of the City of Laurens during the fiscal year 1917, and to create a sinking fund to be used in aid of the retirement and payment of said bonds, and the excess, if any, shall be used by the City Council for other corporate purposes.

Sec. 2. That the Clerk of the said city shall enter said levies and assessments upon the books of the said city and receive aid taxes. That the aid taxes herein levied shall be paid to the said City Clerk in lawful money of the United States on or before the 1st day of March, A. D. 1917, and any person, firm or corporation failing to pay said taxes when due shall be liable to a penalty of 15 per centum of the tax so levied, and also costs of issuing execution and collection as now provided by law for the failure to pay the general County and State taxes.

Done and ratified by the City Council of the City of Laurens and the corporate seal of the said city hereto affixed, this the 4th day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixteen and in the one hundred and forty-first year of the sovereignty and independence of the United States of America.
