NICHOLLS PLANS

BIG SENSATION

Has Not Given Up His Fight on Traxler. Says Nothing, Though It Is Known That He Has Been Proceeding Cautiously With Scheme.

Washington, Dec. 10.—It became known here today, although he would make no comment on what he proposes doing, that a big sensation regarding the Greenville postoffice matter is in sight, with Congressman Sam J. Nicholls one of the interested parties.

Mr. Nicholls returned to Washington Monday and was immediately seen by The State's correspondent and asked for an outline of his plans. He stated very frankly that he had not changed his mind as to what he intended to do regarding this matter, but that for the present he preferred not to say anything for publication concerning the situation which has already become interesting not only in South Carolina but elsewhere for the precedent which it creates.

It has been ascertained from other sources that Mr. Nicholls has been proceeding with caution in his efforts to oust Postmaster D. B. Traxler from the Greenville office and that the statements made by some of those unfriendly to him that they did not believe he wanted Mr. Traxler out, as this would relieve him from the necessity of making a choice from among other candidates for the place, has served to spur Mr. Nicholls on to act more forcibly than before.

It is known that concerted action on the part of Mr. Nicholls and those here who are assisting him in what they believe a good fight to have the postoffice department declare the Greenville office vacant is soon to be taken and that it will prove highly interesting to the people in South Carolina.

The fact that Mr. Nicholls will make no statement for publication at the present time and that from other sources it is learned that he is pro-

ceeding cautiously in the matter, leaves little room to doubt that a sensation of more than ordinary size is in sight in the very near future.

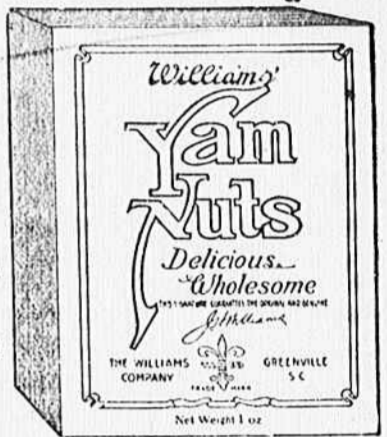
