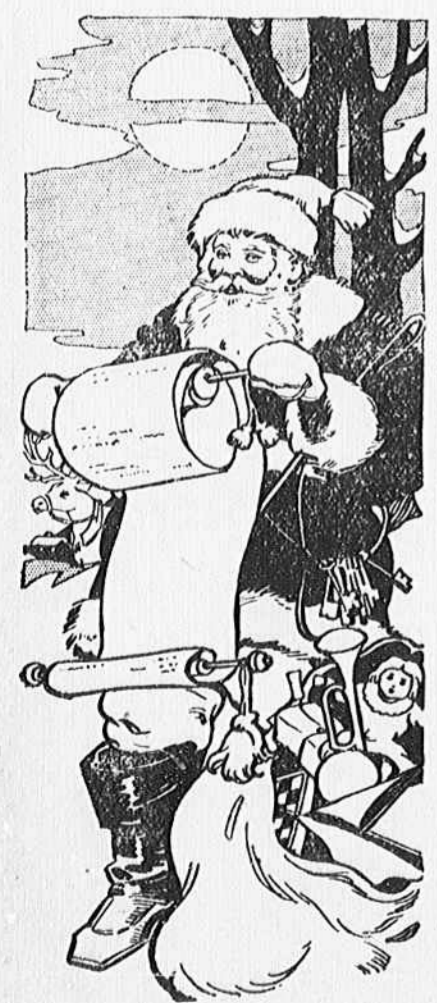
NEXT WEEK'S PAPER.

If you look through a diamond at a black dot on a piece of white paper you will see one black speck quite clearly. If the dot is blurred or multiplied the stone is probably not genuine.

Digestibility of Eggs.
