**TWO NEWSPAPER MEN TELL OF LEAK**

Representatives of Baltimore Sun and Washington Star Admit Authorship of Telegrams to New York and Chicago.  
 Washington, Feb. 3.—Two Washington newspaper men, J. Fred Essary, head of the Baltimore Sun bureau, and W. W. Price, White House correspondent of the Washington Star, admitted at the leak inquiry today that on December 20 last they supplied advance forecasts of President Wilson's peace note of December 21 which eventually found their way to the offices of E. F. Hutton & Company, New York brokers.

Essary swore that it was solely through friendship for P. A. Connolly, a Washington broker and partner of R. W. Bolling, a brother-in-law of President Wilson, and without financial gain that he prepared the telegram Connolly previously testified he wrote and sent to the Hutton house over his private wire. Such information as the message contained Essary said he gained from conversations with other newspaper men and added that he was not one of the group of correspondents confidentially advised by Secretary Lansing that the note was coming.

Price testified that he sent two messages to Chicago brokers, Frederick A. Aldrich and Finley Barrett

& Company, telling them he understood Secretary Lansing was about to issue a statement touching on peace. He said he was regularly employed to furnish such information. Less than an hour later a message using much of Price's language was received by the Hutton offices in New York. Price insisted that his messages were based on information he had received from other reporters, which he did not consider confidential and his own interpretation of the situation.

George A. Ellis, Jr., a member of the Hutton firm supplemented the testimony of both Essary and Price. Edwin A. Roper, telegraph operator for Connolly to whom Essary handed the forecast of the note, told today how Bolling had pleaded with him to tell the truth and set him right before the country. Bolling did not know the source of the note, he said, until within a few days.

For two weeks, said Roper, "Bolling was in tears. He said the public looked at him as though his aster had violated the confidence of the president. I have been wanting to come here, but I did not want to put Essary in wrong."

The hearing will be resumed Monday.

**RELATIONS WITH MEXICO HAVE BEEN RESUMED**

Ambassador Fletcher Left Last Night for Queretaro, Mexico's New Capital, Rebels Giving Trouble.

Washington, Feb. 10.—Henry P. Fletcher left here tonight for Mexico to present his credentials as American ambassador. Accompanied by Capt. Frank R. McCoy, military attaché of the embassy, he will enter Mexico at Laredo, travelling to Queretaro, the country's new capital over the National Railway. The original plan for him to go by way of Vera Cruz was abandoned because of the presence of

rebels along the coast, but rebel operations north of Monterey and south of San Luis Potosi since have been reported and some officials here are doubtful now whether an uninterrupted trip can be made over the route chosen.

Ramon de Neri, in charge of the Mexican embassy, notified his government tonight of the departure of the new representative and asked that he be met at the border by a representative of the foreign office.

Official and unofficial reports continue to indicate growth of the anti-government movement in Mexico. Although the active forces are those

headed by Villa, Zapata, and a few others less widely known, some officials are convinced there is a considerable support being given those in the field by a large group of men in the United States and Europe formerly identified with governmental affairs in Europe.

Information reaching the state and war departments indicates that Villa has in Chihuahua about 8,000 men. Already he has occupied the greater part of the territory evacuated by General Pershing, but officials do not believe he will contest the permanent possession of the field against Caranza's army when it appears.
