

TO LOWER DANISH ENSIGN.

Old Glory to Float Over Islands To-

Copenhagen, March 29 .- The Danish ensign, which has floated over the Danish West Indies for two and a half urday to the accompaniment of salutes from the Danish cruiser Valkyrien and Reuter's Madrid correspondent cables. an American squadron and the Stars and Stripes will be hoisted in its place. According to the present arrangements an American naval representative will take possession of the islands without the state department receive today's

place any time up to April 16. The semeets to pass upon the question of shortage has aggravated the trouble. peace or war with Germany. Any possible complications on the score of belligerent power will thus be voided.

It is assumed here that Saturday's ceremonies will be simple. After the Danish flag is lowered the cruiser Valkyrien will withdraw and return to Denmark with Commodore Konow, its commander and present acting Governor of the islands, Some of the civil Pacific. The names of the vessels authorities will probably remain for some time longer in order to assist the American officials in taking over the administration of the island. They will also be concerned with the question of the future nationality of the islanders who, according to the King's letter of farewell, can retain their Danish citizenship if they so desire.

The purchase price of the islands will be paid in Washington and perhaps retained on deposit in America to assist in financing Danish import trade from the United States. Many suggestions have been made here as to the ultimate use to which the money shall be put, but no decision has yet been reached.




