Columbia, April 4.—Maj. John G. Richards, chairman of the State Railroad Commission, gave out the following statement tonight in regard to the crisis now confronting the American nation.

Our country is now at war with the German nation and every man worthy of the name should be willing, if necessary, to bare his breast and shed his blood for his country's cause. It is the sacred duty of every citizen of the United States to do all in his power from this time until peace again reigns to uphold our president and advance the cause of our government.

"In times that have tried men's souls in the past, South Carolinians have proven themselves equal to every emergency, and in this period of our country's need they will be found true and ready to serve and make any sacrifice that the good of our country demands. Duty is the sublimest word in our language, and South Carolinians never fail to do theirs."

The department of agriculture is authority for the statement that road improvement in Dallas county, Alabama, has added \$5 an acre to the value of lands within half a mile of the improved road.

RURAL ROADS AND BRIDGES

Increase in Annual Expenditures of More Than 250 Per Cent in Past Twelve Years.

During the past 12 years the annual expenditures on the rural roads and bridges in the United States have increased from about \$80,000,000 to about \$282,000,000, or an increase of more than 250 per cent. During this same period the annual expenditures from state funds for road and bridge construction and maintenance have increased from \$2,550,000 to \$53,492,000, or almost 2,000 per cent.

Increase Farm Land Values.

An increase in farm land values varying from 25 to 194 per cent has been produced by improvement of main market roads, according to statistics collected by the federal office of public roads and rural engineering.
