**HOW THE WAR IS
TO BE FINANCED**

Indications That the First Year's Demand Will Amount to \$5,000,000,000 Likely to Issue Bonds.

Washington, April 6.—Methods of financing the war with Germany and extending large loans to the Allies are one of the chief subjects discussed today, cabinet meeting. Indications are that the first year's demands upon the financial resources of the country will run up to even \$10,000,000,000, the sum already asked of congress and may approximate \$5,000,000,000.

Bond issues already authorized are being discussed. These total \$10,000,000,000, including the \$2,000,000,000 Panama canal bonds authorized but not issued. Announcement by Secretary McAdoo as to the details of one or more of these issues is expected shortly, possibly within 24 hours.

Financial and other co-operation with entente governments is one of the chief topics under consideration by the council of national defense, and plans looking to the issuance of loans to the Allies are expected to take definite form within the near future. Opinions as to the amount of the first loans vary between \$5,000,000,000 and \$5,000,000,000.

An official delegation from Great Britain, probably one from France and possibly others from other allied governments, will visit the United States shortly to assist in formulating a definite program adequate to meet the most pressing needs of the allies and at the same time imposing as light a burden as possible upon this country.

It seemed likely tonight that a heavy percentage of the war bill be raised by greatly increased taxation and that whatever bond issues are necessary will be placed through the federal reserve board or raised by popular subscription, or by both methods.

Radical revision of the present income tax is considered as among the probabilities of the war revenue measure to be placed before congress. This revision will probably concern both extremes of the scale, involving lowering of the present exemptions of \$2,000 and \$4,000 in individual incomes, and heavy increases in the rate of taxation at present imposed on incomes of \$25,000 and over.

The opinion prevails among members of the ways and means committee that the government's revenue from this source alone could be brought, within undue hardship, to any one, up to \$1,000,000,000 annually and possibly exceed this sum. The income tax at present rates will

yield approximately \$225,000,000. Revision of the excess profits tax likewise seems certain. The present measure, which allows an exemption of \$5,000 and taxes net earnings of corporations in excess of eight per cent annually at the rate of eight per cent is destined to yield \$225,000,000 annually.

On the other hand, the government could obtain \$1,000,000,000 annually from this source instead of the \$225,000,000 contemplated under the present law.

LINIMENT**CUBA WILL PROBABLY
WAR ON THE GERMANS**

President Menocal Requests Cuban Congress to Declare War on Germany.

Havana, April 6.—President Menocal today sent a message to Congress asking that body to declare that a state of war exists between Cuba and Germany.

The president's message starts by revoking the sending by Germany of her notice of unrestricted submarine warfare. Referring to Cuba's reply to the German note, President Menocal says:

"In complying to the terms of the alarming note the department of state clearly signified the timeliness of a definite rapture of the imperial government persisted in its new plan of submarine war, emphasizing our conformity thereto in accordance with the sentiment of all civilized nations."

"In full and firm consciousness that I am fulfilling one of my most sacred duties, although with profound sentiment, because I am about to propose a resolution which will plunge our country into the dangers of the greatest conflagration in history, but without casting odium upon or without animosity toward the German nation, but convinced that we are compelled to take this step by our international obligations and the principles of justice and liberty, I appeal to the honorable Congress in the use of its exclusive faculties with full knowledge of all the antecedents in the case and with the mature deliberation its importance claims, to resolve as a result of these unjustifiable and repeated acts of aggression by submarines notwithstanding the protests of neutral governments, among them Cuba, that there has been created and exists a state of war between the republic of Cuba and the imperial German government, and adopt all measures necessary which I reserve to myself the right to recommend at the proper moment, for the maintenance of our rights."

Bryan Ready to Serve as Private.

Tallahassee, Fla., April 6.—William Jennings Bryan, three times candidate for president, and former secretary of State, today sent this message to President Wilson:

"Believing it to be the duty of each citizen to bear his part of the burden of war and his share of its perils, I hereby tender my services to the government. Please enroll me as a private whenever I am needed. Assign me to any work that I can do until called to the colors. I shall, through the Red Cross, contribute to the comfort of soldiers in the hospital and through the Young Men's Christian Association aid in guarding the morale of the men in camp."

Mr. Bryan, with the rank of colonel commanded a regiment of Nebraska volunteers during the Spanish-American war.
