ROUMANIANS WILL ALSO CEASE FIGHTIN

Hostilities Suspended on Whole

Jassy, Roumania, Thursday, Dec. 6. -It has been decided that the Roumanian troops shall associate themselves with the Russians in the proposed armistice, though the Roumanians have rejected every attempt at fraternalization, says an official aunouncement made here today.

Hostilities were suspended today on

the whole front. There have been several reports from Berlin and Vienna that the Roumanians had joined with the Russians in the negotiation with the Germans for an armistice, but official confirmation heretofore has been lacking and on Wednesday an official denial of them was issued in London.

The Roumanian troops are holding positions along the Western Moldavian frontier and the line across Southern Moldavia to the Black Sea at which the Germans and Austrians were halted at the conclusion of their drive in 1916.

Russian troops are interspersed with the Roumanians, and the withdrawal of the Russians from active operations would make it almost impossible for the Roumanians menaced by the Bulgarians from the south as well as by the German and Austrian armies of the east, of vastly superior size, to carry out an independent military pol-


