THE NEW TAX PLAN

The state tax commission, with the assistance of the county auditors, has set itself the difficult and thankless task of revising the entire list of taxable property in the state on a basis that should prove as fair as it is possible to make it under present laws.

The new plan will not find favor in all quarters. For instance, there are those who hold that all farm lands in the same neighborhood, with the same advantages as to location, schools, etc., should be assessed at the same value regardless of their actual worth.

Outside of the one class mentioned no doubt the new plan will meet with hearty endorsement. It is not expected, of course, that the tax collectors will be pleased.

The Comptroller General estimates compiled by him for the ways and means committee calls for an aggregate of \$3,442,073.71, an increase over the appropriation bill for 1917 of \$579,208.21, or a levy of nine and three-fourths mills as against the present levy of eight and one-half mills.

The Governor's annual message, which, it is understood, will be essentially a "war document," is expected to suggest some radical measures for the consideration of the Legislature, particularly along lines of South Carolina's participation in the war.

Another thing of vital interest which probably will come up will be a bill providing for the Australian ballot system.
