Florence, March 14.-J. Wilbur Hicks a young attorney of this city, and Geddings Ilderton, aged about 21, also of Florence, were this afternoon declared not guilty of the murder of Dr. William Ilderton, father of the last named defendant, in circuit court here, Judge Hayne F. Rice, of Aiken, presiding.

The motion that the court direct a verdict of not guilty came after the State had introduced several witnesses and rested its case. Mr. Spears made a strong and carnest plea for his clients, claiming self-defense fully established for Mr. Hicks, and contending that no part in the killing of Dr. Ilderton had been proven by the State against young Heetron except that he came to the rescue of his friend, who it appeared, was about to be killed by the deceased. He declared that the State had proven no malice on the part of young Ilderton against his father.

Solicitor L. M. Gasque, for the State, said that although it was an unpleasant duty, he felt that he must oppose the motion for the direction of a verdiet. He declared that it had not been proven conclusively that Dr. Ilderton had fire the first shot, and that if he had not done so Hicks could not claim self-defense; and that it was for the jury to decide whether or not Geddings Hderton had shot through malice toward his father or in defense of his friend, Hicks.

Judge Rice promptly directed a verdiet of acquittal as to both defendants and in taking this action the court stated that it was his policy always to direct a verdict where in case of conviction he would feel compelled to set aside the findings of the jury, and that in this case he would not let'a conviction stand if by any chance such a verdict were returned.


