### HEALTH CONDITIONS IMPROVED IN ARMY

Washington, April 11.-Health conditions throughout the army at home continue satisfactory, says the weekly report issued today by the war department although the hospital admission rate increased over the preced ing week. Influenza and mumps are the chief diseases noted, the latter frequently complicated with pneumonia accounting for the rising admission rate. Ailments among drafted men contracted before they entered camp have swelled the sick rates. The total number of deaths for the week ending April 5 was 290 as against 337 the preceding week.


