MUST GET PERMIT TO BUY FLOUR

Food Administrator Issues Order Requiring Wholesale and Retail Dealers to Get Permission to Purchase Flour in Future.

Columbia, May 11.—The seriousness of the flour situation is being brought home to the people of the state. Only because of the necessity an order was issued today by William Elliott, food administrator for South Carolina that no wholesale or retail dealer in South Carolina may purchase flour, until further notice except with the permission of the food administration.

This ruling of the state food administration applies to all who deal in flour, including commissaries.

This section has been taken by the food administration simply as an emergency measure. Until the new wheat crop comes in there will be close figuring to keep an adequate flour supply. Steps are therefore taken to assure to the people of South Carolina that one section of the state will not be plentifully supplied with flour, while another section goes begging because of the lack of flour. The appeal to the people of the State is to be fair and liberal to their neighbors. The new crop will be available by August.

Through the food administration, a uniform distribution of the flour supply will be made throughout the state, but one dealer in one part of the state will not be permitted to sell a dealer in another part of the state except upon the order of the food administration. The idea being to maintain approximately a 30 day supply all along the line.

In order that a full and complete inventory may be taken, and to provide a basis on which the food administration may work intelligently, all dealers in South Carolina who handle a flour—including commissaries—are required under Mr. Elliott's order, to apply for blanks on which to make up their reports. These blanks may be secured from the office in Columbia of the food administration, and they must be made up by all dealers, whether operating under federal food licenses or not.

The order issued today reads as follows:

"To Wholesale and Retail Flour Dealers in South Carolina:

"You are hereby notified to apply by May 20 for blanks on which to make report of flour on hand. Those who fail to write for blanks or to make report through neglect or otherwise, may later find themselves in an embarrassing situation in obtaining supplies.

"By order of (Signed) WILLIAM ELLIOTT, Food Administrator for South Carolina."

When this inventory is completed, the food administration will know

what sections of the state have an excess of flour and which sections are short of a 30 days' supply. Overstocked dealers in this state will then be aided in moving their flour, and dealers who are short will be quickly supplied.

No notices of the new order will be sent out to dealers direct by the food administration, and the publications of the new order, in the press and at postoffices, will be deemed sufficient for all dealers.

Blanks should be applied for at once, to William Elliott, food administrator for South Carolina, at Columbia.

Brings Heaven a Little Nearer to an American Sammie.

A mother who is a Red Cross worker in her home town gave to her chapter the following letter she had received from her son in France:

"If you could have seen me yesterday, when I left trenches which the rains have turned into open sewers, even you would never have known me. I was mud from head to foot, so covered with crawling things that the poorest tramp in the world would have run from me, and I fairly ached for rest.

"You see, my first furlough had begun, and I caught a train for Paris. We were packed into a freight car. Travel is so congested we spent most of our time stopping. At last, when night came, we were dumped out at a railroad junction with the information that the train for Paris would be along the next day.

"I tell you I was discouraged. Then suddenly across the tracks from our station I saw an American Red Cross canteen, and all my troubles were at an end.

"Lots of people must have the same idea of these canteens that I used to have—just little shacks where you were handed out a cup of sloppy coffee. We are all wrong. These Red Cross places beat a New York hotel for variety of service, even if they don't have the gift furniture and tip takers. Here is what happened to me:

"First I had a bath, a real one, with plenty of soap and water. While I was getting clean my clothes, every stitch, were cleaned and sterilized. Then I had a meal of real American cooking, actually sitting down at a table to eat it. After that I went into the canteen barber shop and have a shave and haircut. Then, being a gentleman of leisure, I strolled into the canteen movie theater and saw some good American films. However, I soon turned in for the night into a clean, dry bed that felt like heaven—or home.

"And now this morning, after a fine breakfast, I am sitting in the canteen writing this letter to you and waiting comfortably for my train. You just can't possibly imagine what these Red Cross women are doing for us soldiers and for the French and English, too. Each canteen takes care of thousands every day.

"They make us feel like human beings once again and give us the nerve to go on with this game of Heking the Kaiser. And when we win you can give a good share of the victory to the American Red Cross."

FULL MAN-SIZED HAM SANDWICH

What Ten Minutes for Refreshments Means in Modern War.

"Think of what refreshments mean 'over there.'" Think of the Sammie or the Poilu coming out of the trenches with a thirty-six hour leave of absence, getting aboard the train or motor on the L. O. C.—the Line of Communication between the front and the rear. Think of these tired fellows stopping ten minutes for refreshments at a Red Cross Canteen.

Think of a big cup of hot coffee and a wealth of man-sized ham sandwiches served by the Red Cross—women with the joy of service in their eyes. Think of ten minutes for refreshments within sound of the guns—such refreshments served by such women. Did ever a weary lad have such refreshments. Did ever a cup of coffee and a sandwich taste so good?

It is service like this, the supplying of "food that's got a honey taste," at a time when a man's spirits are likely to be at lowest ebb, that moved a Commanding General of the American Forces to write on December 20: "The extent of the work of the Red Cross is only limited by the number of members it has and the amount of funds available for its use."
