SEVENTY MEN LEAVE

The local exemption board estimates that approximately 125 men will be sent to the various training camps from this county this month, including those who have already gone. Monday morning seventy white men, consisting largely of farmers who had been given leave to lay by crops, departed on the morning train for Camp Wadsworth. The men assembled on the court house lawn and marched to the depot preceded by the Tambling Shon's band composed of colored men, and where they were given a hearty send-off by a large number of assembled friends and relatives.

Friday morning ninety colored men will be sent off, probably to Camp Jackson and on the 21st 45 white men will be sent to Camp Jackson. On the 29th 147 colored men will be sent to Camp Jackson. The departure of these men will almost exhaust Class I. The exemption board has been notified to have ready the new men who have become of age since last June and who were registered on June 5th. This is taken as an indication that these men will be sent to camp before any other class is entered upon.

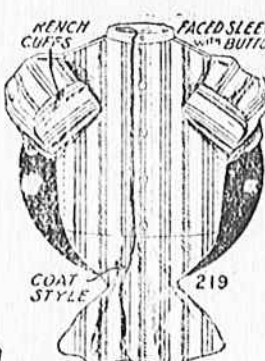
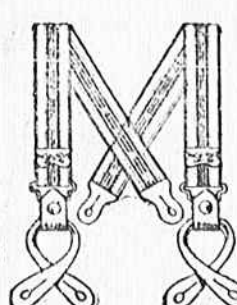

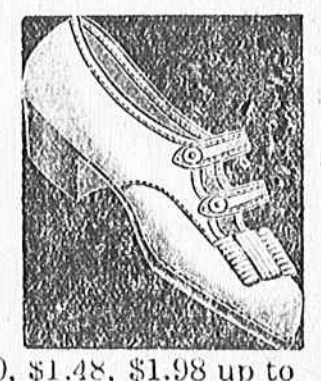
