Naval officers here anticipate, therefore, that the fleet will be divided when the war emergency has passed and substantially one-half of the main fighting strength of the navy go into a reorganized Pacific

More Liberty Bonds to Be Sold, Probably in April.

Washington, Nov. 27.-Notice that the country must prepare for another intensive war loan campaign, probably in the latter part of April, was given today by Secretary McAdoo in a letter to bankers explaining the treasury's program for floating certificates of indebtedness and bonds during the next six months,

The scretary states that plans for continuous sale of government bonds, recently discussed as a strong possibility had been abondoned and that plans should be made for "one more great popular campaign".

Previously he had annouaced that the bonds to be offered then would be of short maturity, less than ten years, and it has been indicated that he amount would be around \$5000,000, 000.
