DEATH OF MR. JEREMIAH STONE.

Well Known Citizen of the County Passed Away Last Wednesday.

Princeton, Nov. 30.—The community was saddened on last Wednesday afternoon, Nov. 27th, to learn of the sudden death of Mr. Jeremiah Stone. He hadn't been so well for the past few weeks, but was never willing to take his bed until just before the end came, which was caused by something like acute indigestion. Mr. Stone was married to Miss Ida Killingsworth, of Laurens county, about 26 years ago and is survived by his wife and the following children: Dr. Diamond and Nickols, of Georgia; Meador, in the army at Louisiana; Patrick, in France; James E. and the two youngest, Joseph and Marshal, of Princeton; Misses Hettie, of Mountville and Felicia, of Limestone college. Besides his wife and children, he leaves a host of relatives and friends to mourn their loss.

The remains were laid to rest on Friday afternoon, Nov. 29th, at Mt. Bethel church in the presence of a large concourse of sorrowing friends and relatives. Funeral services were conducted by Rev.
