

RED CROSS NOTES

The Red Cross Doing a Great Work in Jerusalem.

The awful ravages of war have drawn heavily upon the health of the people of the east. Poorly informed as to hygiene they have suffered greatly. A regular American hospital has been established in the Holy City, and this hospital includes a modern laboratory and dispensary, as well as a Children's Hospital and Clinic. Hundreds of war orphans are being cared for while destitute mothers are bringing scores of sick and starving babies to the dispensary every day. The Red Cross supplies milk, medicine and warm clothing and seeks to stop the awful infant mortality brought about by the war.

More than 6,000 from one locality alone have poured into Jerusalem and all the refugees are delighted with the system of Red Cross baths which are given them and which include a thorough scrubbing in American bath tubs. The clean clothes are also very welcome and these people, with true Oriental enthusiasm, are actually hilarious over the unwonted sensation of cleanliness.

The Armenian refugees who have flocked by the thousands to this refuge to escape the Turks are among the most intelligent, industrious and appreciative of the people who are helped. The Red Cross is establishing schools for these children and are giving the people work as well as immediate medical relief and clinic service where needed.

The Red Cross Faces a Period of Great Activity.

The question as to "What will the Red Cross do now," is one that may be answered in comparatively few words, but the words cover many phases of work. The Red Cross is not a war agency; it is an organiza-

tion for relief in time of stress and the reconstruction period following the greatest war in history is no time for inactivity.

The work of the Red Cross in war is universally known; the work, now that the war is over, will be conducted along exactly the same lines as during the days of actual hostilities. First, the soldiers and sailors over-serve army and they need all the Red Cross has to offer of help, of encouragement and of cheer. As the men come slowly home, numberless difficulties will arise before they can find themselves in their old places in civil life; these difficulties, whether they touch the home or the business life, the Red Cross will help to make easy.

The convalescent soldier and the one permanently disabled will turn to the Red Cross to be helped back to health and to be placed in new industries for which new education is required. During this time of readjustment the men and their families will often need counsel, encouragement and protection, and possibly material aid at times; all of this the Red Cross will give.

America is the one country whose resources are practically untouched by war; famine, pestilence, danger disaster face the countries which have participated in the fiercest struggle known to history. These countries must be helped as well as our own and the Red Cross must do the helping.

Protection from tuberculosis, from other forms of disease, from pestilence and poverty, from suffering and distress must all come from the Red Cross. The passing of war has multiplied the fields of Red Cross activity by increasing the need for the Red Cross a hundredfold.

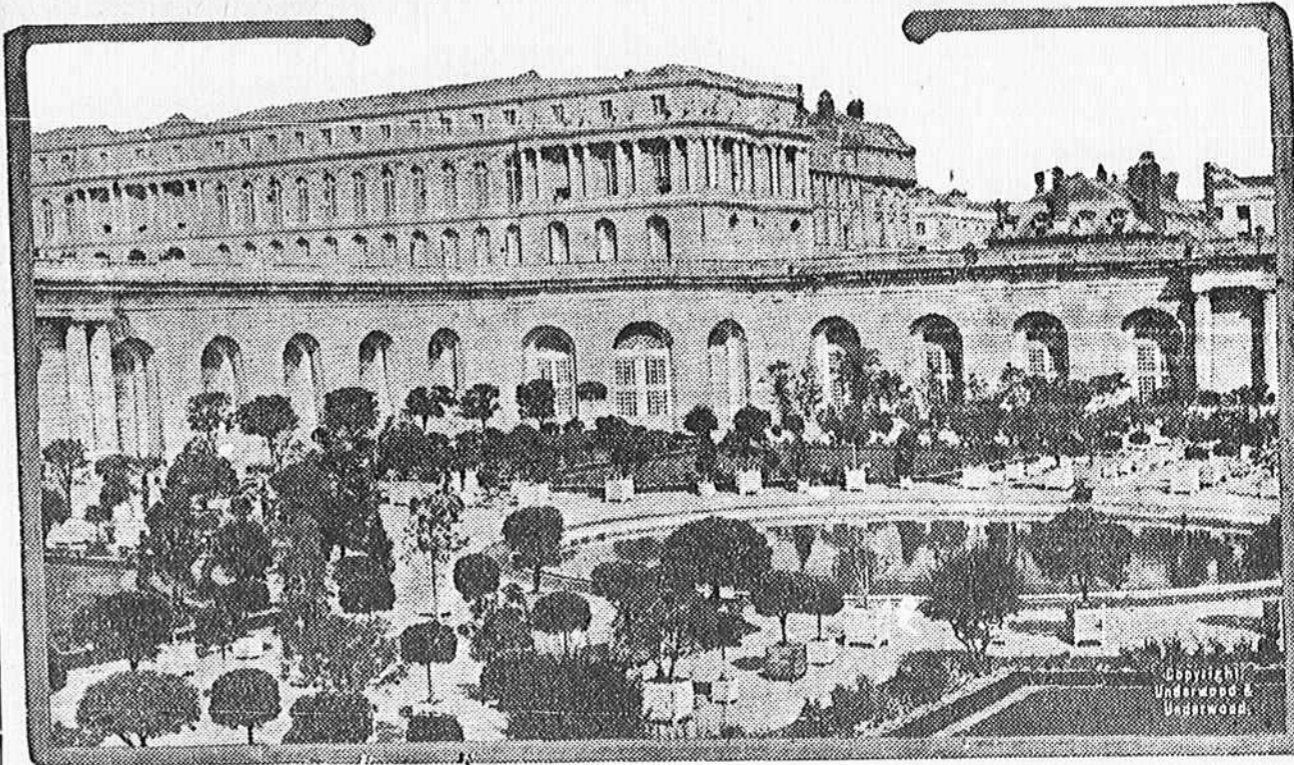
