COTTON REDUCTION.

Editor The Advertiser:

We farmers met last Friday to discuss same plan as to what course we might take by which we might be benefited for years to come. We enjoyed the talks along an agricultural line in its different phases, made by Dr. H. K. Aiken, Mr. Ferdinand Jacobs, Mr. Samuel Mr. W. L. Gray, Dr. Dial, Mr. John R. Finley and others. Two out of this number are what we call farmers, with the court house full of them. The farmers, as a rule, are an uneducated people, and can't make a speech, but as Dr. Aiken says, they ought to get up in these meetings and tell what they know. Now we appreciate everything that the bankers, the merchants and any other man or set of men, will do to assist the farmers, yet we fail to see why the farmers don't make the grandstand play themselves when they have the power in their own hands. Now let's see! The bankers have their associations, the doctors, the railroad men, and every vocation in life except the farmers. Now, why can't the farmers do the same? You can't organize them. We came out of that meeting the other day and put out feelers and heard but few say that they would reduce their acreage, as they were planting about 10 acres to the plow now. But we are like our friend, Mr. Finley. We met to say what we would reduce, and every man ought to reduce or be ostracized. If he fails to come up to the requirements. We can't tell you how many farmers in this community have from one to three brood sows and are raising pigs for the market, and the whole country is full of nice pigs for sale. Now let's raise less cotton and more of other things that we really need, then we can pay what we owe, and put some money to our credit in the banks of the county, then we would not have to call on anybody for help but the Lord and Master. This so-called high price cotton which the bears speak of, has put everything on the farm so high that the farmer can't make ends meet. No, he will not own his home much longer if he undertakes to farm, and stand for what his hands are obliged to have, unless he has money of his own, and buys goods at wholesale prices to meet whatever the price of cotton may be. Anything like a 13 or 15,000,000 bale crop would put cotton below ten cents per pound. Now, fellow farmers, listen to what one of your brother farmers tells you. Unless we change our way of doing business on the farm, we are to blame ourselves, and will have to work harder to make ends meet. You see the guano people are going to put the price per ton \$10.00 up, and some of the farmers are hauling it out with the understanding that if the price goes down you will get the benefit of same. Now, why don't the farmers say, "We are going to keep our hands off the guano business until it comes down or use none," and you would see how the cat would jump. We hear that some of the farmers are loading their cotton to the mills, and waiting for the cotton to go up. How in the world will the price go up unless you make less and keep your cotton off the market. We are glad that we attended the meeting last Friday. After all we still have faith in our brother farmers, as they are not quite the fools they look to be.

FOCH'S MILITARY TERMS PRINTED

Generalissimo Would Limit German Army to 200,000 Men of Ten Divisions. Proposals will be taken up Monday.

Paris, March 1.—Marshal Foch presented today to the council of the great powers the military terms to be incorporated in the peace treaty. These will be considered Monday with the council.

The military terms provide for the disarmament of Germany down to twenty divisions of ten thousand men each.

Including 15 division of infantry and five of cavalry. Severe restrictions are placed on the manufacture of all classes of war materials and the military and commercial use of the airplane is limited to the minimum.

Beyond Marshal Foch's presentation of the terms today, they were not discussed.

The naval terms now before the council provides not only for the complete suppression of Germany's submarine equipment, but also for the termination of all submarine warfare by all nations throughout the world, thus ending the use of the submarine in naval warfare.

The provision for dismantling the fortifications of Helgoland and Kiel canal has been made the subject of reservation by Admiral Benson, representing the United States, whereby this shall not be a precedent applicable to American canal and harbor defense, such as Hell Gate, Cape Cod canal, and others.

The proposal for the destruction of the large German warships is approved in the report by the British and American naval authorities, but the French still make reservations against the destruction of these ships.

The supreme council is expected to pass on this and other naval and military subjects Monday.

Paris, March 1.—The official statement on today's session of the supreme council, issued this evening.

"The representatives of the allied and associated governments met at the Quai d'Orsay today at three P. M.

"Marshal Foch submitted the report of the military representatives on the supreme war council regarding the military conditions to be imposed on the enemy.

"Signor Crespi, in the name of the financial drafting committee, submitted the list of questions requiring solution which referred to the financial commission.

"M. Clementel, on behalf of the Economic Drafting Committee, explained the economic questions requiring solution in the peace treaty which were referred to the commission.

"The next meeting will take place on Monday, March 2, at three p. m."

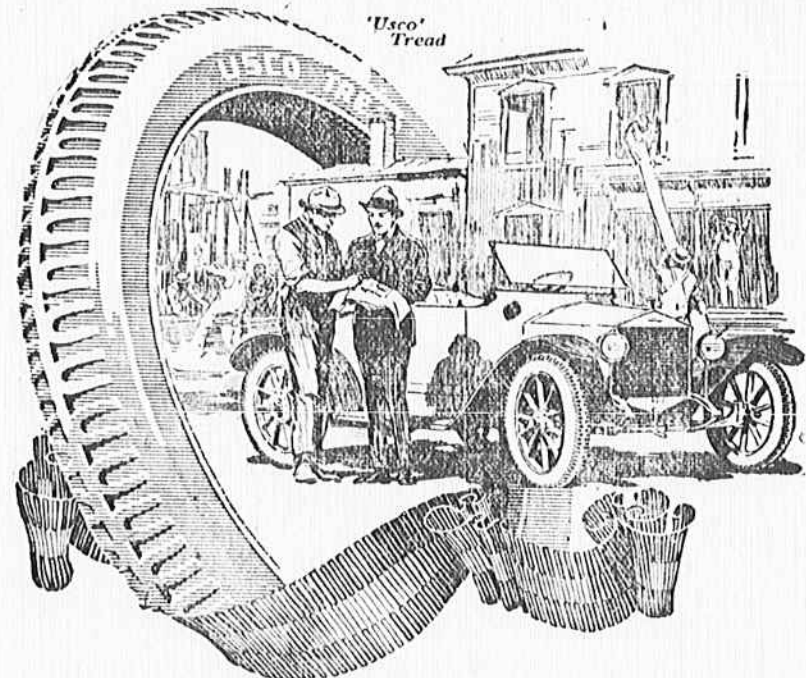
