### WILL NOT NOW ADDRESS CONGRESS ON LEAGUE

Senator Hitchcock Makes Strong Plea for League in Answer to Its Critics.

Washington, Feb. 27.—Further important expressions of opinion on the league of nations came today from President Wilson in his conferences at the capitol, from Senator Hitchcock, of Nebraska, chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee, in an address to the Senate, and from senators and representatives who attended the dinner last night at the White House.

President Wilson, in discussing the league with members of Congress and also at a conference with newspaper correspondents, expressed confidence in the success of the plan. He also let it be known that he had every expectation of the conclusion of peace within a few months and in this connection said that territorial adjustments presented the most delicate problem remaining. Work on all other questions, he stated, is rapidly nearing completion by the commissions appointed to handle it.

The President was emphatic in expressing his belief that in no particular did the proposed constitution of the league conflict with the American constitution or the Monroe doctrine. He also said he had in mind only one amendment, designed to clarify the cause dealing with enforcement of territorial decrees and reiterated that he would not address Congress before it adjourns and would not ask any formal expression from the Senate on the league.

Mr. Wilson was said to have indicated that he was reluctant to reopen the league constitution before the peace conference. He was represented as feeling that with document approved unanimously by fourteen powers later many weeks' deliberation it would be inadvisable to reopen the negotiations unless changes proposed were fundamental. The change he has in mind was not so classed by the executive.

Senator Hitchcock in addressing the Senate in vigorous support of the league, replied to recent critics of the plan. He declared that the alternatives before the world were peace with the league or war and preparations for war without it; the internationalism of nations or that of "the socialist, the anarchist and the Bolshevik," the senator flatly denied that the league violates either the Monroe doctrine or the principles enunciated by Washington and charged opponents with magnifying what they regard as dangers and with "conjuring up a scarecrow."

Senate debate will be resumed tomorrow, with addresses by Republican Leader Lodge and Senator Freelinghuyzen of New York, Republican. Today Senator Owen, of Oklahoma, Democrat, introduced a resolution advocating amendment of the league to definitely declare that American sovereignty is not affected, while Senator Spencer, of Missouri, Republican, offered a resolution proposing that the league be excluded from authority over "purely American questions." Both resolutions went to the foreign relations committee without prospect of action before adjournment of Congress.

### HOME DEMONSTRATION DEPARTMENT.

### Wilt Resistant Tomato Seed.

The U. S. Department of Agriculture has sent to the Home Demonstration Agents several packages of wilt resistant seeds for experimental purposes. I have distributed these seed among the club members, but still have a few packages which I shall be glad to give to anyone who has trouble with tomato wilt.

Those securing these seeds should follow directions carefully and we prepared to give a report at end of the season. Seeds from these tomatoes are also requested to be saved for other members another year. If you have tomato wilt this summer, secure seeds from these club members this fall for next year.

Plant the wilt resistant varieties and the commercial variety that is to be used as a standard of comparison on same day and in same hot bed. When ready to transplant, set the wilt resistant plants and commercial plants side by side in wilt infested soil. Keep the varieties separate, yet close together so they will all be grown under similar conditions.

If any of your wilt resistant plants begin to die of what you think is Fusarium wilt, take up one or two whole plants including the roots, wrap them in several thickness of newspaper, and send to me. I shall send them to Washington for the identification of the disease.

### Fusarium Wilt.

Fusarium wilt starts in the roots and spreads into the stem, leaves and fruit. Its most common symptom is a yellowing of the leaves which slowly progresses from the base to the top of the plant. When all the leaves of the stem die the stem turns brown and gradually dies backward from the top.

There are several other tomato diseases such as leaf spot, Bacterial wilt, Sclerotium wilt and root knot, which may be confused with Fusarium wilt. Leaf spot destroys the leaves but not the stems, and small circular spots appear on the stem and leaves, but there is no blackening under the bark.

Bacterial wilt is somewhat similar to Fusarium wilt, but it kills the leaves quickly and the whole plant often dies in a few days. It causes a blackening of the stem tissues but the color is not so black as the Fusarium wilt and frequently extends into the pith. The sap may often be drawn out into strings by touching it with the fingers.

Sclerotium wilt usually starts in the stem at the surface of the ground. It causes decay at this point and often covers the affected area with reddish brown bodies about the size of mustard seed.

Root knot may be distinguished from other tomato diseases by the pearance of enlargements or swellings of the roots. Although a plant may be attacked by two or more of these diseases it is usually possible to distinguish Fusarium wilt by the slow and progressive yellowing and death of the leaves tending from the base to the tips of the stem and by blackened area encircling the stems under the bark.

Club members are requested to keep this article for reference in case of diseases among tomato plants.

The livestock specialists and county agents who have encouraged increased hog production now

stand ready to help market hogs to best advantage.

Whatever home and local markets do not demand at good prices can be shipped to Richmond and Baltimore to advantage, and wherever necessary cooperative shipments can be made. Telegraphic quotations

received here recently quote good corn fed hogs around \$17.50 to \$18.; pigs and lights \$17 to \$17.50; soft hogs \$15 to \$17.

Farmers who need help in this problem should call on their county agents or write the Extension Service of Clemson College.
