

WILSON'S METHODS

ANGERED ITALIANS
President's Publication of Position Regarded as an Insult by Orlando.

Paris, April 24.—Premier Orlando and the other members of the Italian delegation apparently are much angrier over President Wilson's world-wide publication of his position on the Adriatic question than over his opposition to their claims and the fact that the diplomatic procedure has been violated and what is termed an insult offered to the Italian government because the president made his position known to the Italian people over the head of peace delegation.

Discussing this contention today a member of the American peace dele-

gation says: "Fiume or nothing" has been the Italian delegation's unalterable formula for nearly eight weeks and their firm insistence upon the settlement of the Adriatic question before an agreement on the peace terms forced President Wilson to tell the world where he stands. The atmosphere of the conference simply had to be cleared, and there was no other way for the president to clear it.

"This statement was more for the American public than for the Italian public and it was of such an unmistakable character that it should not leave any one in the dark as to the American position on secret agreements".

The effort of the Europeans to invoke their rules of diplomatic procedure and the conflicting statements,

clouded under obscurity have been noted by the American delegates and correspondents who are endeavoring to obtain the actual facts. The professions of surprise by the Italians of President Wilson's statement are amazing to the correspondents, who have positive knowledge that the statement was submitted to Premier Orlando several days before its publication and that he sought advice about drafting a reply.

Many conflicting accounts of the events immediately preceding Signor Orlando's announcement of his departure have been printed in the Paris papers, some of which profess to quote the premier. But these statements have been disavowed by Signor Orlando, who requested the press to await an official signed statement.

In the meantime all Paris is discussing the Italian situation and indulging in speculation and what would happen were Italy to break with the conference and insist upon keeping troops in Fiume.

Griffith Spectacle Coming.

Through special arrangements just completed, David Wark Griffith's tremendous spectacle, "Hearts of the World" with a special symphony orchestra, has been secured for a limited engagement here and will be seen at the Opera House two days, May 5th and 6th, twice daily, 3 and 8:30 p. m.

"Hearts of the World" is the big Griffith production on which this master genius spent more than eighteen months, and during the making of which he was in France working un-

der the auspices and with the hearty co-operation of David Lloyd George, Prime Minister of England, and other British and French officials. This, however, does not indicate that "Hearts of the World" is a war play, for Mr. Griffith has been exceptionally anxious to have it known that this latest effort is a simple love story with the recent war serving only as the background. He describes it as "the story of a village; an old fashioned play with a new fashioned theme." The unfolding of the romance takes place in a French village prior to and during the German occupation, and all the experiences of the French throughout those trying times are graphically depicted as only Griffith can do it. Those who have seen his former triumph, "The Birth of a Nation," will

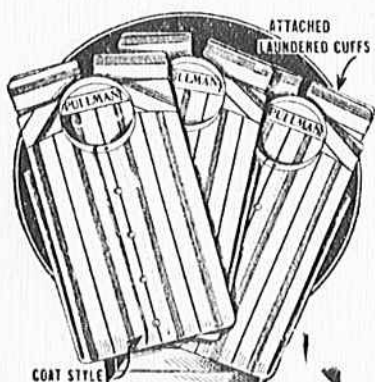
realize just what this means, for Griffith is a producer who masterfully stops at nothing to accomplish his ends.

Some idea of the magnitude of "Hearts of the World" may be gained from the fact that more than one million men and women figure in the story, as do fifty thousand horses, squadrons of airplanes, fleets of Zepelins, hundreds of lumbering tanks in action and miles of artillery.

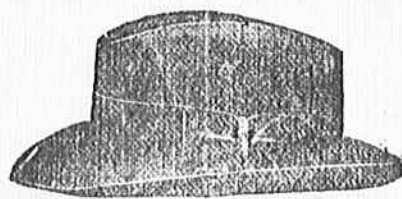
