### RATIFICATION OF TREATY HOPED FOR

Heir Presumptive of Ottoman Throne Makes Appeal in Behalf of Own People.

Constantinople, Dec. 3.—Abdul Medjid Effendi, son of former Sultan Abdul Aziz, and heir presumptive of the Ottoman throne, in an interview given the Associated Press today, expressed the hope that the United States would ratify the treaty of Versailles and made an appeal in behalf of his own people.

"It is stated that the Turkish peace is being delayed because of the attitude of the United States," Abdul Medjid said. "It should be remembered that we have been warring for the last ten years. We are exhausted. Pity should be taken on us and on our homeless people who are living in the utmost misery."

"It is a fine opportunity that America has to help us. It was not our fault if we got into war, but because France and Great Britain sided with Russia against us. For centuries we lived on good terms with the French and the British, and also we sought no quarrel with Russia."

"I warned the French and the English before the war that they were forcing us to Germany's side. It would have been a shorter war for them with the Bardenelles open, if I had been listened to. Also I realized that a German alliance would ruin us, as we already had had too many wars. What should be done now? It will be remembered that Alsace and Lorraine were one of the causes of the great war. Well, if Turkey is partitioned it will make new problems of the same kind."

"For the sake of the whole of humanity let the United States of America continue its fight for an honest peace for all the world. Let the United States, whose honor is pledged in behalf of humbler peoples, continue fighting until a real victory of peace is achieved. If the United States quits now it will mean new disasters, and also it may drag her into new quarrels which will cost more sacrifices than the present peace involved."

Prince Medjid is nearing his fiftieth year. For 33 years he was a prisoner under the late Sultan Abdul Hamid in a palace on the heights of Scutari, where he studied languages, politics, history, philosophy and gave part of his time to painting pictures. The prince is a large man of florid complexion, light blue eyes and smiling open face. He is reputed to be democratic and is studying English in the hope of traveling in Europe and America when the Turkish peace is signed.

### SUPREME COUNCIL GIVES MORE TIME

Rumania Has Extension of Several Days.

Paris, Dec. 5.—The supreme council has extended until December 8 the time allowed Rumania to reply to the council's note.

An official note of explanation regarding the delay, after reviewing the history of the relations with Rumania, says:

"All these patient efforts resulted in an attitude conciliatory in words only, but negative in deeds."

The council decided on November 15 to make a last appeal, as the time limit for Rumania's answer expired December 2.

The Rumanian reply, however, "the note says, "was not in conformity with that expected by the supreme council. Taking into consideration the resignation of the Rumanian ministry and the very recent meeting of the new parliament the reply was limited to a request for a further delay which would allow the newly constituted government to assume its responsibilities in accord with the king and parliament."

"If the supreme council had insisted upon its former modification," the note continues "it would have, in view of the indefinite reply received from Bucharest, severed relations with Rumania, since, despite repeated requests, Rumania had refused to continue during a period of six and a half months."

"However, desirous of incalculably manifesting its moderation, and to evidence the extreme regret with which it would see Rumania deprived from the office, the supreme council decided to accord a further and last delay of six days to Rumania. This extension will begin Tuesday, December 2, and expire Monday, December 8."

"The council hopes that this favor will be fully appreciated at Bucharest by the new government whose declaration will definitely indicate the political intentions of Rumania and her respect or disregard for the decisions of the peace conference."

### HIT BY MACHINE LITTLE GIRL DIES

Little Girl, Three Years Old, Succumbs to Injuries, Automobile Party Escapes.

London, Dec. 3.—While attempting to cross the highway in front of a car, little Lella Ellis, three year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Ellis, of Waterloo Mill village, was so badly injured Tuesday morning that she died Wednesday.

No one knows who the occupants of the car were but a partial description says that it was a Ford and was occupied by one man and two women, and it was evidently a car from another state as it had luggage on the running board and bore a license tag with red numbers and the driver shaken his head, but after seeing what had happened he left the scene at a rapid rate, it is alleged, and nothing further has been heard of the party.

There were several eyewitnesses to the accident, but no one got the number of the car and without an accurate description, the police have little to work on and it is feared they have made good their escape. One witness testified that the man made every effort to avoid striking the child.

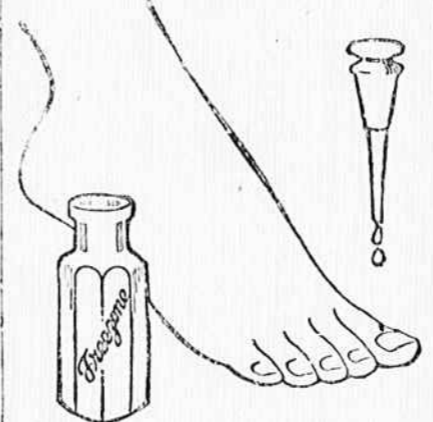

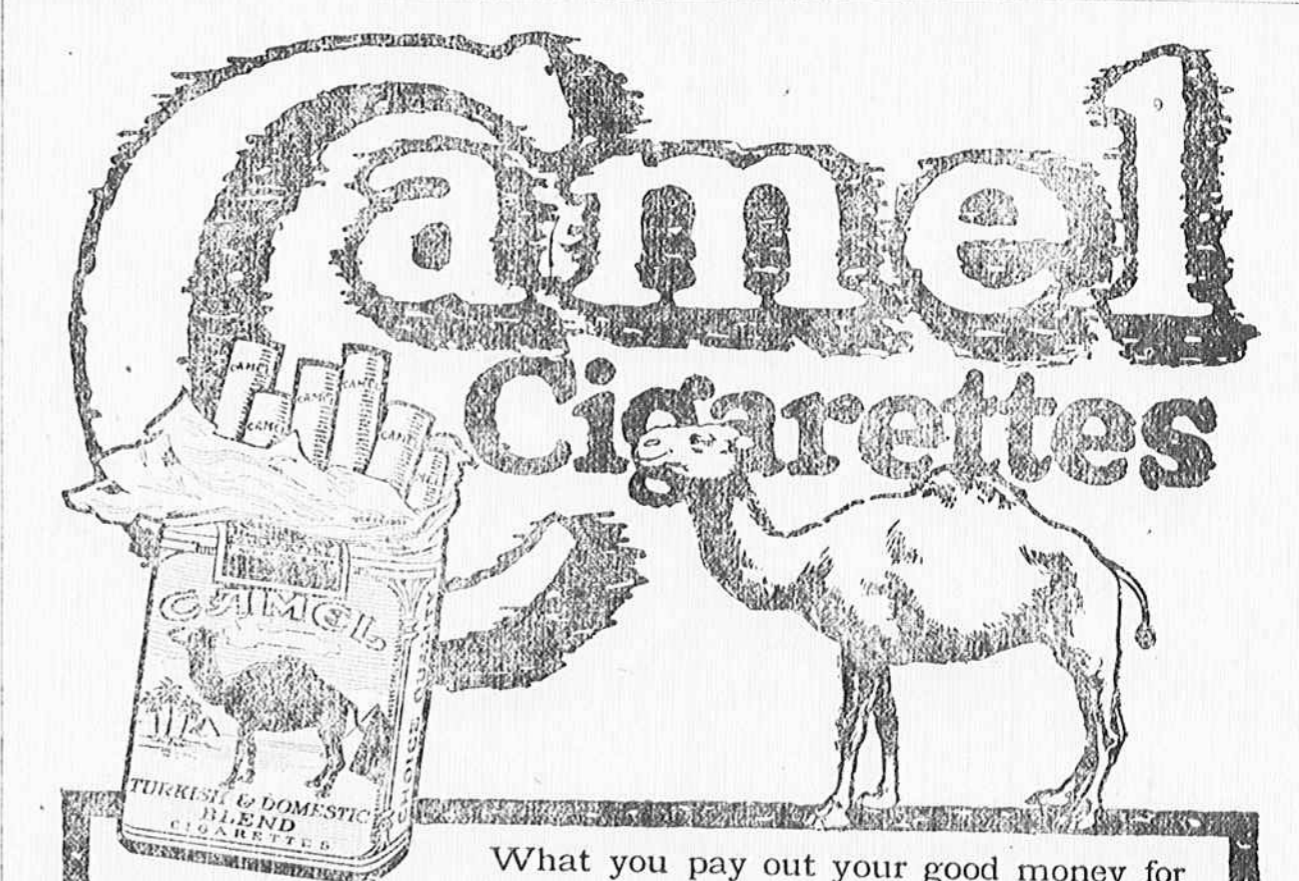
