His boyhood was spent on the farm which his father conducted in addition to practising medicine. After attending the "little red school house" of the neighboring town until he was 14 he entered the Ohio Central College at Iberia from which he was graduated in 1882. He paid most of the expenses of his tuition from his own earnings in cutting corn, driving teams, working as a railroad laborer and also in painting barns. He also worked in the office of the village paper and there learned the art of setting type and "making up" forms. In his graduating year he taught a village school and also played the horn in the village band.


