FINAL PLAN FOR REUNION IS MADE

Old Hickory Association Committee and Ashevilleans Discuss Last Details.

Asheville, Sept. 3.—At a joint meeting of the Asheville central committee and officers of Thirtieth Division or Old Hickory association held at the board of trade rooms tonight, arrangements were largely completed for the entertainment of 7,500 men of the Thirtieth Division at the second annual reunion of the association.

The meeting was attended by practically every member of the central committee, a number of citizens interested in the reunion including several ladies who have been canvassing the city for homes for the men, H. B. Springs, president of the Old Hickory association, W. B. Bowen, secretary and treasurer and Major E. D. Meyer of Charleston, who is chairman of the association entertainment committee.

Homes for 3,500 more men are needed to take care of the number of men who will attend the reunion and Mrs. Chas. A. Webb, chairman of the Ladies committee, has been making a canvass of the city.

Chairman Curtis Bynum of the city food committee reported that food had been ordered and all plans made for feeding the boys, the menus reported indicating that his part of the entertainment will be one of the biggest features of the reunion. Chairman S. O. Ingram of the county food commission reports over 1,900 dozen eggs in the neighborhood of 1,000 fat hens in storage and 500 people of Buncombe County would provide the remainder of 100 hens. He is well pleased with the liberality of the people of the county in the matter.

Chairman B. C. Brockman of the entertainment committee stated that four buildings have been decorated today as a constant reminder that the reunion is just around the corner and that Asheville will be more profusely decorated for the Thirtieth Division than for any other occasion in its history.

Dr. A. S. Wheeler, chairman of the music committee reported that arrangements were complete for 4 military bands which will afford a rare musical treat for our visitors and citizens.

Col. H. B. Springs, president of the Old Hickory Association in presenting the tentative program of the reunion, took occasion to state that he was pleased with the remarkable progress made by various committees in Asheville sometime ago and said that he had told everybody when discussing the reunion that no city in the country could rival Asheville in its matchless hospitality to its visitors and Chairman Erskine, general chairman expressed gratification and appreciation of the splendid work of the various committees.

ANTIS HAVE FOUR PLANS IN FIGHT

Every Effort to be Made to Defeat Suffrage Brought by Tennessee's Action.

Washington, Sept. 5.—Four methods to be used by anti-suffragists to bring about a decision by the supreme court before the November election on the legality of ratification of the federal suffrage amendment were outlined in a statement issued here tonight by the American Constitutional League.

The anti-suffragists, according to the statement, propose first to appeal pending litigation as to Tennessee's ratification to the Tennessee supreme court which meets September 29. An attempt will be made to have the case appealed or certified from the Tennessee court to the supreme court.

The second method outlined is to bring injunction and mandamus proceedings against election officials to keep women from voting and thereby cause suffragists themselves to help expedite the case speedily to the highest court.

The third proposal is to have an attorney general of one of the twelve states which have not ratified refuse women the vote and carry the case into the supreme court at once on an original jurisdiction in the name of a sovereign state.

Should these methods fail, anti-suffragists, according to the league, hope to carry to the supreme court the appeal from the District of Columbia supreme court's dismissal of an injunction to restrain Secretary of State Colby from proclaiming the suffrage amendment's ratification.

Reports Investigated of Unusual Liberties Granted Jack Johnson.

Chicago, Sept. 3.—The United States district attorney's office today began investigation of reports in the Chicago Journal that Jack Johnson, former pugilist, now a prisoner in the Geneva Jane county, jail, is permitted to take long walks, go automobile riding, and stages a daily training bout to which the sheriff issues tickets.

The Journal account states that a reporter sent to see Johnson found he had gone riding with a number of wo-

men, and that after waiting until nearly midnight the reporter left before Johnson's return.

Johnson, who surrendered on the California border, after eight year's self-imposed exile, is waiting arraignment in connection with his flight after being sentenced to a year and a day in Leavenworth for violation of the Mann act.

Women Vote For First Time in State.

Columbia, Sept. 5.—The first ballots to be cast by women in South Carolina will doubtless be cast in Eaulclair, a suburb of Columbia, in an election Tuesday on the question of voting an extra levy of nine mills for general school purposes. Several women have qualified to vote and will doubtless cast their ballots in the school election.

SECOND PRIMARY ELECTION.

Notice is hereby given that a second primary election of the Democratic party will be held Tuesday, September 14, 1920, for the purpose of nominating candidates for the following offices which were not filled in the first election: United States Senator, Solicitor for the Eighth Judicial Circuit, Lieutenant Governor, Railroad Commissioner, State Senator, one Representative in the Lower House of the General Assembly, Clerk of Court, Sheriff and Magistrate of Waterloo Township.

The election will be held at the polling precincts hereinafter named in the respective club districts by the managers hereinafter named. The managers shall open the polls at 8 o'clock in the forenoon and close them at 4 o'clock in the afternoon when they shall proceed to publicly count the votes. After tabulating the results the managers shall certify the same and forward the ballot box containing the ballots, poll lists and all other papers except the club roll relating to such election by one of their number to the chairman of the county committee within thirty-six hours after the close of the polls and said election shall be conducted in all respects according to the laws of the state of South Carolina governing primary elections and according to the rules of the Democratic party.

The list of polling places and managers of same will be the same as in the first primary.

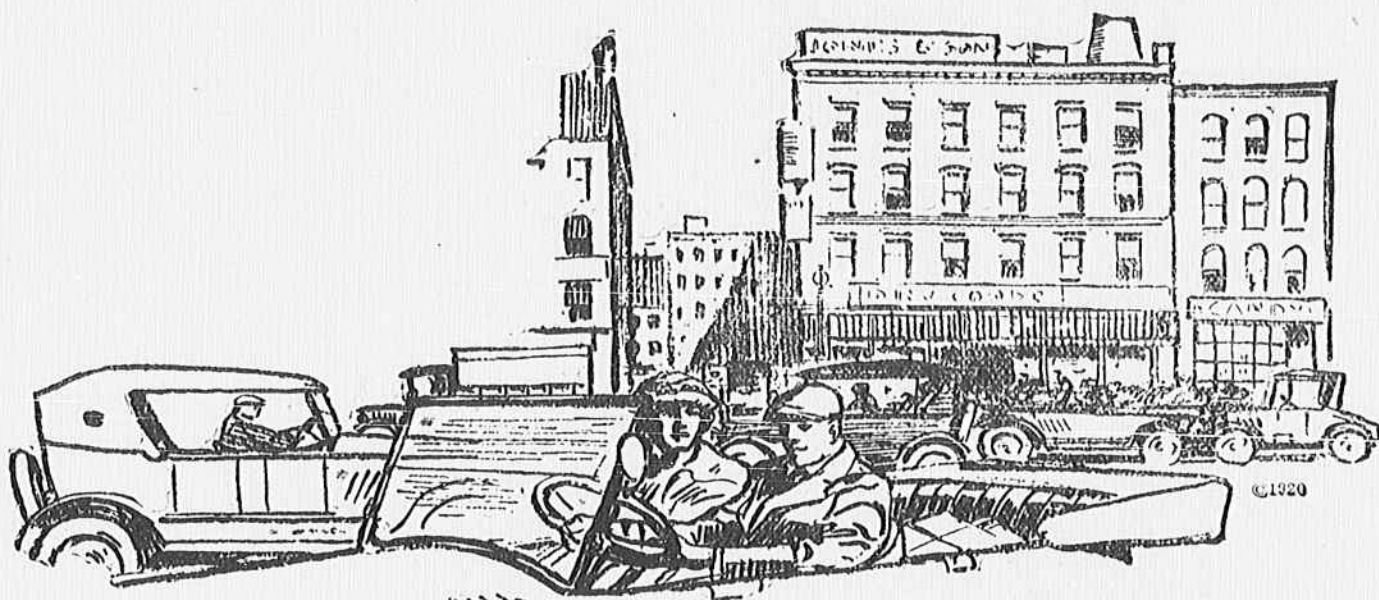
