Every Effort be Made to Defeat Suffrage Brought by Tennessee's Ac-

Washington, Sept. 5 .- Four method: to be used by anti-suffragists to bring suffrage amendment were outlined in statement issued here tonight by the American Constitutional League.

The anti-suffrafilists, according to the statement, propose first to appeal pending litigation as to Tennessee's ratification to the Tennessee supreme ourt which meets September 20. An attempt will be made to have the case appealed or certified from the Tennessee court to the supreme court,

The second method outlined is to bring injunction and mandamus proceedings against election officials to keep women from voting and thereby cause suffragists themselves to help expedite the case speedily to the high

The third proposal is to have an ittorney general of one of the twolve states which have not ratified refuse women the vote and carry the case into the supreme court at once on an original jurisdiction in the name of a

overeign state. Should these methods fail, anti-suffagints, according to the league, hope to carry to the supreme court the appeal from the District of Columbia supreme court's dismissal of an injunction to restrain Secretary of State Colby from proclaiming the suffrage amendment's ratification.

Chicago, Sept. 3.-The United States district attorney's office today began investigation of reports in the Chicago Journal that Jack Johnson, former pugilist, now a prisoner in the Geneva Jane county, jail, is permitted to take long walks, go automobile riding, and stages a daily training bout to which the sheriff issues tickets.

The Journal account states that a reporter sent to see Johnson found he had gone riding with a number of wo-


