Mr. Scott said the government activities against price gougers "had accelerated and aided rather than retarded" renewal of the effectiveness of the law of supply and demand.

Perhaps the most striking illustration of this was the success of the representatives in Pennsylvana in convincing one of the largest Philadelphia merchants of the wisdom of making a voluntary reduction of all commodities handled by him. 
