**DRIVE ON PRICES**

**WILL CONTINUE**

Department of Justice Carries on. Statement by Scott. Regardless of Dissolution Monday of Fair Price Organizations of Government Department.

Washington, Oct. 30.—The department of justice will continue its drive on profiteers "wherever and whenever found" regardless of the dissolution Monday of the fair price organizations, according to a statement issued tonight by Robert T. Scott, assistant to the attorney general who formally announced the disbanding of the fair price committee. In a view of the organization's work, Mr. Scott claimed credit for the department in forcing down prices of many commodities.

The campaign against exorbitant prices has been of "substantial benefit" to the average citizen, Mr. Scott said. He added that more than 2,000 cases had been instituted by the department and that scores of these had resulted in fines or prison sentences under the profiteering provisions of the Lever law. The cases remaining on court dockets will be pressed, he said, and new proceedings started where evidence of the law's violation is found.

"The objective of the department," Mr. Scott said, "has been first to eliminate the profiteer. And, second to make his field less attractive by educating the buying public to the wisdom of sane and sensible buying."

Difficulty has been experienced by the department, according to Mr. Scott, because of the "judicial doubt" existing as to the constitutionality of the Lever law. Unfavorable decisions were said to have given profiteers a new grip in some communities but Mr. Scott believed the legal attacks started by the government had served measurably to discourage the wave of profiteering.

Mr. Scott said the government activities against price gougers "had accelerated and aided rather than retarded" renewal of the effectiveness of the law of supply and demand.

"Another important factor," he said, "has been the action of fair price representatives in inducing patriotic merchants to effect reductions in prices. Perhaps the most striking illustration of this was the success of the representatives in Pennsylvania in convincing one of the largest Philadelphia merchants of the wisdom of making a voluntary reduction of all commodities handled by him. This reduction of 20 per cent. resulted in a general wave of price slashing throughout the country from which the consumer substantially benefited."

**VOTES ARE CAST**

**AT WHITE HOUSE**

Ballots Mailed to New Jersey. Mrs. Wilson Votes. Mrs. Tumulty Also Joins Husband in Forwarding Expression of Choice.

Washington, Oct. 30.—The president and Mrs. Wilson voted today in the presidential election. They marked their ballots at the White House and mailed them to Princeton, N. J., where the president heretofore has gone each election day to vote.

The other ballots were also forwarded to New Jersey today from the White House, those voting by mail, including Secretary Tumulty and Mrs. Tumulty, Dr. Stockton Axson, a brother of Mr. Wilson's first wife; Charles Swem, the president's private stenographer, and other attaches of the White House.

These were the first ballots ever cast by Mrs. Wilson and Mrs. Tumulty and they were among the first of the great army of women enfranchised by the 19th amendment to vote in the 1920 election. The ballots from New Jersey were forwarded to the White House early this week by request.

Most members of the president's cabinet and many other government officials as well as employees will go to their old homes to personally cast their ballots.

A large number of federal officers and other Washingtonians, however, will cast their votes by mailing ballots to the places where they maintain residences.

Preparations were being made today at the executive offices of the White House for the receipt of election returns next Tuesday. The president will be kept informed of the progress of the counting of the ballots by means of wires installed in the executive offices communicating with the various Democratic headquarters over the country.

Four years ago the president went by special train to Princeton to vote as at that time it was not possible for him to vote by mail.
