VOLSTEAD ACT HURTS PASSENGER VESSELS
Representatives of Steamship Lines Say That They Can Not Compete With Foreign Ships If They Are Banned Dry at Sea as at Home.
Washington, Jan. 13.—American passenger steamship officials appealing today to the house judiciary committee for modification of the Volstead act, frankly declared they would be unable to compete with ships of foreign registry for the trade of the world unless permitted to handle liquors for use by patrons beyond the three mile American limit.
About the only consolation they obtained at the end of an all-day hearing was a prediction—not for the record—by Representative Dyer, Republican, Missouri, that "they didn't have a chance." This comment was made in open session after Wayne Wheeler, general counsel for the Anti-Saloon league, in opposing any let down in the present law, expressed the opinion that some day the world would be dry and that the ships of all nations would sail over the seven seas without a drop of liquor aboard.
The shipping interests insisted, however, that they had to deal with problems of the present day, that there has been wholesale cancellation of reservations on American ships by travelers who found other vessels bound for the same ports unaffected by prohibition restrictions, and that the great task of trying to make the American flag supreme on the seas could not be carried on in competition with Great Britain and other nations free of all legislative handicaps.
P. A. S. Franklin, president of the International Mercantile Marine, warned the committee that the death knell of the merchant marine was sounded if the ruling by Attorney General Palmer that American ships at sea or anywhere in the world, could not sell liquor, was permitted to stand. Speaking as he said in all seriousness, and "with no attempt at flippancy," E. A. Quarle, president of the U. S. Mail Steamship company, declared owners would be "fit subjects for examination in a psychopathic ward" if they invested any vast sum in the building and conditioning of ships without assurances that they would be allowed to compete on equal terms with the countries endeavoring now to dominate ocean commerce. Representatives of other lines said all they could hope to obtain was the overflow of travel.

Harris Livermore, president of the United American line, told the committee that construction of many trans-Atlantic vessels had been contemplated but that "with this hanging over us we can not go ahead until the question is determined." Half a dozen witnesses, representing many captains, testified that as the law stood today it gave a distinct advantage to foreign traders because foreigners and a multitude of Americans refused to travel on dry ships if they could book passage on others where the serving of wines with meals was not a crime.
Mr. Wheeler alone was heard in opposition to the plea of the steamship folk, made at hearing on a bill by Representative Edmonds, of Pennsylvania, ranking Republican member of the merchant marine committee to exempt passenger vessels engaged in foreign trade from provisions of the Volstead law. Asserting that many ships now were "bootlegging" Mr. Wheeler said the amendment would multiply the difficulty of the dry law's enforcement and that it would be a bad precedent to rush to the relief of everybody whose business was damaged by prohibition.

TWO RING LEADERS GUILTY OF MURDER
Redding and McGavie Will Be Hanged for Part Taken in Chicago Riot.
Chicago, Jan. 13.—Grover C. Redding and Oscar McGavie, alleged ring leaders in the Abyssinian riot on June 20 last, in which two men were killed, were found guilty by a jury tonight of the murder of Robert L. Rose, a sailor at the Great Lakes naval training station, one of the two victims of the outbreak, and were sentenced to be hanged. The five other defendants were found not guilty.
Redding and McGavie were the leaders of a cult which advocated the return of negroes to Abyssinia, and, according to testimony at the trial, told prospective members that if they returned to Abyssinia they would be given a home and land free.
A parade of members of the cult was held on June 29, during which an American flag was burned.
Several bystanders led by Rose attempted to interfere and two of them were shot and killed.
