The Chronicle hints of certain assurances which had been received in Clinton that Laurens would vote for the Musgrove project. Except on the contingency that something was promised in return, and we would not charge that Clinton attempted to trade with any section on this election...

Outside of its charges of prejudice in Laurens against Clinton, we believe the main contention of our Clinton contemporary is that since Clinton town pays one-seventh of the taxes of the county that it should receive a larger share of the benefits from the road bond issues...

To prove the existence or non-existence of prejudice is a very difficult matter, but The Advertiser is quite confident that the Laurens vote in the election was not a prejudiced vote and that, moreover, many local voters strained their consciences a point or two in order to be sure they were giving Clinton a fair deal...

The Advertiser Explains Our friend Editor Lee, as official spokesman for Laurens, has gone into a lengthy discussion of the matter as you will see, yet there are several things he mentions that we want to call attention to...

The Advertiser says that Laurens needs to make no explanation of its vote. Probably not, for their position can't be explained. The Advertiser in its lengthy, illuminating article fails to tell us why Laurens voted for the Owings road and against the Musgrove road...

It is possible that these 123 yeomen were influenced by prejudice against Clinton. The Advertiser asserts, Why? Why are our Laurens neighbors willing for us to help pay for the construction of roads in their section yet unwilling to help pay for such improvement effecting Clinton?

The Advertiser says that "the largest opposition cast in the county against the Musgrove road by Laurens was to be expected because of their distinction of being the largest box in the county."

vote for the Owings road, excepting Clinton, came from their box, and in the original bond issue the largest affirmative vote cast in the county came from this same box. Why should this precinct now be expected to pile up an opposition vote? The vote is the answer, Clinton was involved...

The Advertiser says "that the favorable Laurens vote was probably cast to give Clinton an arithmetical share of the benefits derived from the taxes it pays." While we are ready to admit that the policy of returning to the territory the proceeds of taxes paid could not be completely adhered to...

In conclusion, we are glad we can state that Clinton has always voted for road improvement in the county though we have realized little of the benefits. The issue for the Musgrove road was forced from here as The Advertiser asserts and our commercial organization unanimously adopted the two projects when they were ordered by the legislature...

The Clinton vote for the Owings road leading into Laurens was 175 yes, 21 no. The Laurens vote on the Musgrove road leading into Clinton was 55 yes, 123 no.
