**DIAZ OF ITALY IS
VISITOR IN THE CAPITOL CITY**

Accompanied by Other Illustrious
Leaders in the Late War. Given
Rousing Reception by Harding and
Others.

Washington, Oct. 23.—Diaz, of Italy; Beatty, of England, and Jacques of Belgium, allied leaders whose deeds in the days of a world war have written their names large in history, came to Washington today to be received by President Harding before continuing their journey to Kansas City, where they will be honor guests at the American Legion convention.

The distinguished visitors were given a formal welcome by American government and Legion officers and a tumultuous one by crowds at union station and along flag-bedecked Pennsylvania Avenue. They will be received tomorrow morning at the White House and before their departure probably will visit Mount Vernon and Arlington.

Each occupying with his suite a separate car on a special train, General Diaz, Admiral Lord David Beatty and Lieutenant General Baron Jacques arrived at 2:30 p. m. from New York. The generalissimo of the Italian armies was the first to leave the train. He was greeted by Robert Woods Bliss, third assistant secretary of state, representing the President, Admiral Coontz, chief of naval operations; Brigadier-General Andre Brewster, with their aides, and by national and district officials of the American Legion and the commissioners of the District of Columbia.

Lord Beatty, with Lady Beatty and their son, were then welcomed formally and after them Baron Jacques and his party. These ceremonies over, Baron Jacques halted the official program to send for and congratulate the engineer and fireman of the train, J. A. McCue and F. S. Maharty, for the fast run from New York.

There was a fanfare or trumpets as the visitors were escorted up the train platform to the President's room in the station. Cheers followed cheers as the crowds which jammed every vantage point in the vast concourse caught sight of the allied heroes.

The cordiality of the greeting extended to him in New York and here, General Diaz said "gave the feeling of assurance of American friendship, that the aims of the two nations were similar and that our two nations understood each other."

"That sentiment of solidarity will bring them to a common interest and progress for civilization," the Italian leader added.

Asked as to his visit to Washington, Lord Beatty said:

"If any human being in any humble capacity can do anything to bring nations closer together and to cement their friendship—and our friendships are already being cemented—he is performing a great public service to the whole world."

The admiral was enthusiastic about Washington, declaring his visit had given him a great thrill.

"I am here," he said, "as the guest of the American Legion and I owe them a deep debt of gratitude for inviting me to this country."

"We Belgians do not admire the Americans—we love them," was the message given by Baron Jacques.

"America is a great friend of Belgium," he added, "American soldiers did much for Belgium. American support in every way made Belgium feel in her hour of peril that she had a big-hearted, warm friend."
