AN ORDINANCE

Imposing a License Tax on Persons Who Engage In, Prosecute or Carry on Any Business or Profession in the City of Laurens.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAU

Section 1. That no person, firm or corporation shall, after the first day of January, 1922, engage in, prosecute or carry on any business or profession hereinafter named, within the cor-porate limits of the City of Laurens, without having first paid a special license tax therefor. Sec. 2. All licenses issued for one lay only shall be double the amount above mentioned for Saturdays, show days, Christmas days and other days of public gatherings.

Sec. 3.

That all licenses issued under and by virtue of this Ordinance shall be non-transferable and, exshall be non-transferable and, except a license for a day, a week or a month, shall terminate and end on the 31st day of December of the year in which they were issued; but may in which they were issued; but may of December A. Sec. 4. Any person, firm, company or corporation proescuting or engaging in any business, occupation or profession, or keeping or maintaining any establishment named in this Ordinance without having first paid the license tax imposed thereon, shall, up-50.00 one hundred dollars, or be imprisoned not exceeding thirty days with or without hard labor at the discretion of the officer trying the case. Sec. 5. Where a license is imposed by this Ordinance upon any business, profession or occupation, and such business, profession or occupation is carried on or conducted by an agent, clerk or employee, such agent, clerk or employee shall be subject to all the penalties herein imposed should the said business, professional or oc-cupation be carried on or prosecuted without the license imposed having been paid, in the same manner as if such agent, clerk or employee were the proprietor of such business, pro-

Sec. 7. For any business, trade, occupation or profession not enumerated in Section 1 of this Ordinance, the license shall be fixed by the City Council of the City of Laurens at any regular or special meeting thereof.

Sec. 8. The license taxes herein imposed are levied for the purpose of raising funds to meet the annual or-dinary expenses of the City of Laurens for the fiscal year commencing on the 1st day of January of any year hereafter and for the purpose of pay-

AN ORDINANCE

State of Eouth Carolina, City of Laurens.

An ordinance to levy an annual tax upon the taxable property within the corporate limits of the City of Laurens, to raise supplies to defray bond-ed indebtedness of the said City of Laurens for the fiscal year commencing January 1st, 1922, and to pay past indebtedness of said city, and also to levy and collect a sufficient amount to pay the interest upon the bonded indebtedness of the said city for the year 1922, and to raise a sinking fund for the payment of same.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Laurens:

Sec. 1. That a tax of One and 95-100 Dollars on every one hundred dollars worth of property, real and personal not exempt by law from taxation within the corporate limits of the City of aurens, be and the same is hereby levied for corporate purposes to de-fray the public expenses of the City of Laurens for the fiscal year, commencing January 1st, 1922, and to meet other indebtedness as has been contracted by said city for corporate purposes; That an additional levy of fifty-five (55) cents on every one hundred dollars worth of the assessed value of all property, real and personal, not exempt from taxation, sit-uated within the corporate limits of the City of Laurens, be and the same is hereby levice, to meet the interest accruing on the bonded indebtedness of the City of Laurens during the fis-cal year 1922 and to create a sinking fund to be used in aid of retirement and payment of said bonds, and the excess, if any, shall be used by the City Council for other corporate pur-

Sec. 2. That the Clerk of the said shall enter levies and assessments upon the books of the said city and re-ceive said taxes. That the said taxes herein levied shall be paid to the said City Clerk in lawful money of the United States on or before the 1st day of March A. D. 1922 and any person, firm or corporation failing to pay said taxes when due shall be liable to the penalty of 15 per centum of the fax so levied, and also cost of issuing execution and collection as now pro-vided by law for the failure to pay the

AN ORDINANCE

State of South Carolina. County of Laurens, City of Laurens,

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Laurens: Sec. 1. That all able-bodied male esidents of the City of Laurens, between the ages of 18 and 60 years, shall each pay a per capita tax, for street improvements, the sum of \$2.00, street improvements, the sum of \$2.00, on or before the 1st day of March, 1922, and all persons failing to pay said street tax on or before that date shall pay to the City Clerk the sum of \$4.00 as such street taxes, and failure to do so shall, upon conviction, be punished as otherwise provided by the City Ordinance.
