\$6,151,323 \$4,866,296 The county treasurers of Anderson, Beaufort, Cherokee, Chesterfield, Florence, Greenville, Jasper, Kershaw, Lexington, Richland and Spartanburg did not respond to The News and Courier's inquiry. The total assessment of these counties for State and county taxes in 1921 was \$6,849,610.

The treasurer for Laurens sent the figures for state taxes only. Laurens county's total assessment was \$438,-217.82.

On the basis of the averages shown in the reports from the other thirtyfour counties, this would mean that there is still something like \$2,500,000 of the 1921 taxes to be collected in the counties which have not been heard

In addition, therefore to the \$1,-250,000 of 1920 taxes which remain uncollected it is probable that well over \$6,000,000 of the 1921 taxes are still outstanding.

This in itself should be sufficient warning of the necessity for retrenchment; but the story is not yet ended. It is brought out by several of the treasurers that the taxes which have been paid have come in many counties largely from the railroads and corporations. In Williamsburg county onethird of the 1921 taxes have been paid, but the county treasurer has written receipts for only one-sixth of the entries on the books. Out of every six property owners in the county five have still to pay their taxes.

Identically the same situation exists in Hampton, where one-third of the taxes have been collected. "But where, oh where," asks County Treasurer R. E. Causey, "is the balance coming

Officials said that Lincoln had made several attempts to return legally to this country after his deportation from England to Germany, but was denied the necessary permission.

Records of the department of justice show that he came to this country prior to the entry of the United States into the World War and after he had been accused of spying in forgery and in August, 1915, was held for extradition to Great Britain. He escaped from a Unite States deputy marshal in January, 1716, however, and was not captured until three months dater. Lincoln was born in Hungary, but later became a naturalized British subject and a member of Parliament.


