White Stains on Hardwood A mixture of salt and olive off will remove white stains from hardwood which are caused by hot dishes. The dry spot is covered thickly with salt. and then as much olive oil is poured over as the grains will take up. This stands over night, and in the morning the discoloration should be briskly rubbed with the mixture, which is then wiped off. If there is still any trace of stain, the application is repeated, again standing for hours.


