**HERRIN GRAND JURY RESUMES PROBING**

Marion, Ill., Oct. 23.—The Herrin grand jury, which today resumed its investigation of the Herrin mine killings after a month's recess, late this afternoon returned an indictment for murder, naming 48 persons and announced it had completed its work. This makes 114 persons the grand jury has indicted in connection with the rioting in which 23 men were killed.

Circuit Judge Hartwell, before whom the indictment was returned, expressed the opinion that the true bill is illegal because it was returned at the September term of court by a grand jury impaneled by the July term of court.

State Attorney Delos Duty, expressing an opposite opinion, and stated he would appeal to the state supreme court if the indictments were declared illegal.

Those indicted today were charged with the death of Ignace Kubinis, the last victim of the rioting to expire, who died since the grand jury took a temporary adjournment thirty days ago. Only a few witnesses were heard today and they are said to have told of wounds inflicted on Kubinis, and which are said to have resulted in his death.
