Speech of Congressman Tillman.

Mr Chairman, Gentlemen of the Convention and Fellow Citizens.—For the eighth time in succession have I had the proud gratification to receive the nomination of the people of this district for Congress.

What adds to this gratification is that I have been chosen during most trying times. We have just come out of a war. We have been plundered ever since we were conquered.
