Becky Johnson a colored woman, was killed by lightning in Newberry during the rain storm last Friday af-ternoon. She lived in a house on the south side of Harrington street, near the railroad trestle. She had gone to the house of Maggie Johnson, on the opposite side of the street, and was standing in the doorway talking to her when she was struck by the bolt of lightning and killed instantly. The other colored woman was sitting on a box just three feet off from the woman who was killed, and although considerably shocked she was not injured. Coroner Lindsay held an inquest, and next morning had the woman buried —the colored people declining any assistance whatever.

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
