She was married November 28th, 1865, to Joseph Davis. He was fatally injured by a train running over him April 16th, 1874, and in a few hours breathed his last in the Charlotte depot in Columbia. Mrs. Davis was left alone with an infant son hardly two years of age, and in a few months a baby girl came to claim a share of her love and labor.

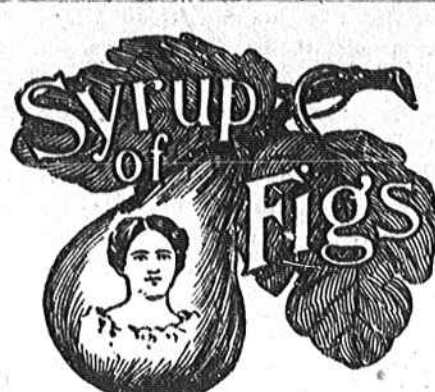
