A CALAMITY FOR SPAIN

Prime Minister Canovas Shot Down by an Assassin - Anarchist Conspiracy.

Madrid, August 8. - Senor Canovas del Castillo, the prime minister of Spain, was assassinated to-day at Santa Agueda, by an anarchist. The murderer fired three shots, two of which struck the premier in the head and the other in the chest. The wounded man lingered unconscious for two hours and died at 3 o'clock this afternoon. His wife was but a short distance away when

The wounded man fell, dying at the feet of his wife, who was with him lingering in agony for an hour and then passing away with the cry of "Long live Spain!" which were the last words upon his lips.

The assassin was immediately arrested. He is a Neopolitan and gives the name of Rinaldo, but it is believed that this is an assumed name, and that his real name is Micheal Augino Golli.

The murderer declares that he killed Senor Canovas "in accomplishment of a just vengeance," and that the deed is the outcome of a vast anarchist conspiracy. He is believed to have arrived at Santa Agneda the same day as the premier. He was frequently seen lurking in the passages of the bathing establishment in a suspicious manner.

DEATH OF SENATOR GEORGE, OF MIS-SUSSIPPI,

Washington, August 14. - Sonator teorge of Mississippi, died here to-

Sonator George was not a native of Mississippi, but had resided in that State since his nightly year. He was born in Monroe County, Goor gia, on the 20th of October, 1826 After the death of his father, which occurred in the sonator's early in lancy, he removed with his mother in 1834 to Noxubee County, Mississippi, comaining there for only two years, and then going to Carroll County, whore he maintained his logal residence until his death.

Sonator George obtained his edueation in the common schools and did not begin his professional career until after the close of the Mexican war, in which he served as a private in the regiment e manded by Jefferson Davis. He afterwards took an active part

a the civil war, easting his lot with the South. He left the convention hall to become a captain in the 20th regiment of the Mississippi volunteers. He rose to the rank of brigadier general of State troops before the close of the war. When the war closed, Mr. George returned to Carroll County, resuming the practice of his profession and later entered poliies. In 1879 he was appointed to the supreme bench and soon afterwards elected chief justice, in which capacity he was serving his State when first elected to the United States Senate in 1881. Had he been permitted to serve his entire term, on the 4th of March, 1899, he would have completed his 18th year in the senate. He had declined a re-election more than a year ago on account of his health, and Hon. H. D. Money has been chosen as his successor for

the term beginning in 1899. Senator George was well-liked in he senate notwithstanding a rather brusque manner. Those who knew nim realized fully that beneath the outward crust was hidden a kindly and gentle disposition. He was also universally respected for his great erudition on legal and constitutional questions. Probably there has been no man in the senate during the present generation who had made greater research into constitutional questions or could discourse more profoundly upon the instruments of government.
