An Ordinance. TO LEVY A SPECIAL TAX ON two and one-half mills, in accordance with an Act of the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, entitled "An Act to authorize all cities and towns to build, equip and operate a system of Water Works and Electric Lights and to issue bonds to meet the cost of same," approved the 2nd day of March, 1896.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Newberry, S. C., in council assembled and by the majority of the same, That and by the authority of the same, That a special tax of two and one-half mills on the dollar of all property (except the property of churches and institutions of learning) within the corporate limits of the town of Newberry be and the same be hereby levied and ordered and required to be paid into the treasury of the said town, to provide the means wherewith to pay and discharge the interest and one-fourth of the principal of the bonds issued for the purpose of building and equipping a system of Water Works and Electric Lights for said town.

SECTION 2. That the said special tax herein levied shall be collected at the same time the general taxes of the said Town of Newberry are collected.

SECTION 3. That the Clerk and Treasurer of said town shall enter each and every amount of money received under the levy of the special tax herein provided, in his books of account, under a separate account, and no money so received shall be applied to any other purpose than the payment of the interest and principal of said bonds.

SECTION 4. That the Clerk and Treasurer shall include in his annual statement, and sign and publish therewith, each year a separate statement of the amount levied on by the special tax herein provided, and of its application.

SECTION 5. That the Ordinance shall be and continue in force from the first day of January, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, unless sooner repealed, Done and ratified under the corporate seal of said Town this 25th day of September, 1897.

An Ordinance. TO RAISE SUPPLIES FOR TOWN purposes for the fiscal year ending December 31st, 1897.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Aldermen of the Town of Newberry, S. C., in council assembled and by the majority of the same, That a tax of 2 1/2 Cents on each one hundred dollars worth of real and personal property (except the property of churches and institutions of learning) be and the same be levied and ordered to be paid into the Treasury of said Town.

SECTION 2. That the taxes herein levied shall be paid to the Clerk and Treasurer of said Town, in lawful money of the United States, from the 1st day of November to the 1st day of December, 1897. Done and ratified under the corporate seal of said Town this 25th day of September, 1897.

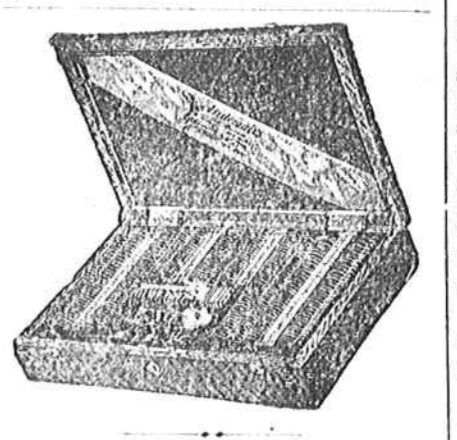
