Washington, September 23.—Following the custom in the case of a minister who has been obliged to leave his post by the breaking out of hostilities, Stewart L. Woodford has filed his resignation as minister of Spain. It is believed that it will be six months before the United States has reason to send a minister to Madrid again, and if Mr. Woodford's resignation remains so long not acted upon, his status will be merely nominal, his salary for under the law, his salary ceased after the expiration of sixty days from the date he left his post, with the addition of a sufficient period of time, to enable him to return to the United States.

It might have been possible for Gen. Woodford to have returned to Madrid in the capacity of United States minister, but this would only have been the case had the Spanish government seen fit to make a request to that effect.
