TO THE CITIZENS OF NEWBERRY CO.

I had hoped that the race for sheriff would be conducted on a high plane and free from slanders and personalities. In this it seems that I have been disappointed. The usual campaign slanders is abroad. Among other things that have been said upon my person, I am informed is that I am using free passes. This I pronounce absolutely false. I have no free passes. To show to the public how frivolous these slanders are I will state that I have a contract to do detective work for one of the roads in payment for which I have an annual pass over that road.

Mr. M. M. Buford, Newberry, S. C., Dear Sir: In accordance with our verbal arrangements, that in consideration of an annual pass over our road to be issued to you, you would do from time to time such detective work for us free of further charge, I herewith send you an annual pass for the present year and will hereafter in each year send you a renewal of it.

This arrangement as a understanding is to continue until one of us, you or I, we notifies the other of the termination of it. If this meets your approval, simply write on the back of this letter the word "approved" and sign your name and return this letter to me. I have been very much surprised by several attempts that have been made to wreck this transaction by tampering with the rails of the road.

I will send you a copy of this letter to the other party to the agreement. If these news are true, I will be glad to see you. I am, Sir, very respectfully, M. M. BUFORD.
