A FATAL FIRE.

The Barn of Mr. T. F. Harmon Burned Early Sunday Morning—A Live Wire Kills One of the Faithful Colored Firemen.

The citizens of our city were awakened at 3.30 o'clock Sunday morning by the sounding of the dreaded fire alarm.

The fire proved to be the barn and carriage house of Mr. Thos. F. Harmon, of Ward 4, which was totally destroyed.

The barn contained a lot of cotton seed hulls and meal, and under the sheds were a carriage, buggy, sulky and harness which were all destroyed, also two calves were burned up in their stall.

Mr. Harmon estimates his loss at between \$400 and \$500. No insurance. The fire department responded promptly and did good work in preventing the fire from spreading to the buildings from igniting.

A FIREMAN KILLED. Henry Johnson, colored, a member of the Acton Fire Team, met his death at this fire in a rather peculiar manner. One of the electric light poles was right at the fire and the wire was burned in two and fell to the ground, Henry became entangled with the wire and was killed by the current before he could be extricated. He was killed in less than two minutes' time.

Several members of his company received shocks in attempting to extricate him from the live wire. He was buried Sunday afternoon by his firemen. Henry was a faithful fireman and met his death like a hero, leading his company on to duty.
