

EFFECT OF NEW LAW IN REDUCING NUMBER OF PENSIONERS

Fewer Applications than Heretofore Havbeen Received and of those Received a Number Have been Rejected-Tho Number Granted this Year is 6,-Reduction of 1,368.

[News and Couries.]

Columbia, April 24.--Special: The State board of pension commisioners finished their work today. The pension list this year shows a decrease of 1,368 as compared with last year. The reduction is largely due General Assembly. Under the old Act any widow of a Confederate Veteran who was in needy circumstances was entitled to a pension, whreas under the present Act a widow to receive a pension must herself be 60 years or over, or be a widor who died of wounds during the

It will be interesting to note how the pensioners of the State are distributed and how some counties have a decidedly larger number of pensioners than might be expected. Of course, in Greenville and Spartanburg, and the upper tier of counties, where there is a heavy white population, the numbers can be fully understood, but how some counties with a comparatively small white population can have so many more pensioners than Churleston or Orangeburg, for instance, is not so easily understood.
