TRYING TO HELP HAMPTON.

THINKING ONLY OF HIS NEEDS, NOT THE MAGIC OF HIS NAME.

to believe that my recommendation would have great weight with him. I could not recommend a man unless he was fit for the office and willing to accept it. I knew Gen. Hampton was well qualified to discharge the duties of postmaster of Columbia, but I did not know whether he would accept the place or not.

"I then talked the matter over with three Columbians and I asked one of them to ascertain if General Hampton would accept appointment as postmaster of Columbia, and to make it perfectly plain that absolutely no conditions would be attached to the appointment, but that if he accepted it he would not be framed in any way and would be considered absolutely free to support or oppose whom he pleased.

"In conclusion I desire to state that the information of my offer was given the public by me. I told McLaurin of what I had done and he said it would have given him pleasure to have used his influence in behalf of Gen. Hampton to secure him an office without pledge or condition. I said nothing about the matter to anybody else and am at a loss to understand how it became public.
