PROF. W. K. SLIGH RESIGNS. Has Been Connected With the College for Nearly Fourteen Years—Resignation to Take Effect January 1st.

Prof. W. K. Sligh has sent to the Board of Trustees his resignation of the chair of mathematics in Newberry College, the resignation to take effect on January first of next year. For some time his health has been failing and bad, and it was for this reason alone that he decided to hand in his resignation.

Prof. Sligh graduated from Newberry College in the class of 1887, and one year later was elected to a professorship in the college and took charge of the preparatory department. He continued in this department for four years, when he was tendered the chair of mathematics, which position he accepted and has held continuously since that time. This year would have completed the fourteenth year of his connection with the college, the longest time it has been continuously served by any man except the late Dr. Holland.

Prof. Sligh's resignation will be received by the professors and the entire student body with deep regret.

The Case Not Proved. More than usual pension fraud cases have come up at this term of the United States court. Amongst others already mentioned in The Record is the case of two lawyers of Newberry, Messrs. Sale and Fant. From the circumstances it appears that these gentlemen acted as attorneys for a pensioner who having been accepted, and having received several hundred dollars, the attorneys charged a certain percentage and collected it. The law does not allow more than \$25 to be collected by an attorney in a pension case. The attorneys do not seem to have been familiar with this provision, and as no criminal intent seems to have been involved, the case was not pressed on the attorneys paying the excess fees.—Columbia Record, 12th.
