

THE CHILD LABOR LAW

Elsewhere in this issue is printed the full text of the Child Labor Law which went into effect on the first day of this month.

The main provision of the law are that after May 1, 1903, no child under ten years shall be employed; after the first of May, 1904, no child under 11, and after the first of May, 1905, no child under 12.

That no child under the age of 12 shall work at all before 6 o'clock in the morning, or after 8 o'clock at night, except to make up for lost time, and then not after 6 o'clock at night.

Children of a widowed mother or totally disabled father who are dependent upon their own labor for support, and children who are dependent upon their own labor for support, are exempt provided an affidavit is filed with the county superintendent, and filed with the county superintendent, and filed with the county superintendent.

Any manager, overseer, clerk of a mill, or other person who causes a child to be employed in violation of this law shall be fined not less than \$100 and not more than \$500, and imprisoned not less than 30 days and not more than 60 days.

Chalmers wrote me a letter last year who I heard was killed by lightning. If you could put this in the hands of any one of my relatives, it would be a great favor to me and my mother.
