horse's neck, move your hand over toward the side which faces the way you want the horse to go. A knowing horse will move away from the rein applying slight pressure. You'll upset a western horse if you start dragging on the rein to pull him toward the side you are tugging.

On the trail the gait is easy. You don't post in a western saddle. You sit on it and ease just a little with feet solidly in the stirrups. Let your pony handle his own feet, over rough terrain give him his head. He knows best. After you've lived with him awhile, you'll find you, self in partnership with a four legged outdoors man that is worth knowing.

On and after January 1, 1949, the penalties prescribed by law will be imposed on unpaid taxes.

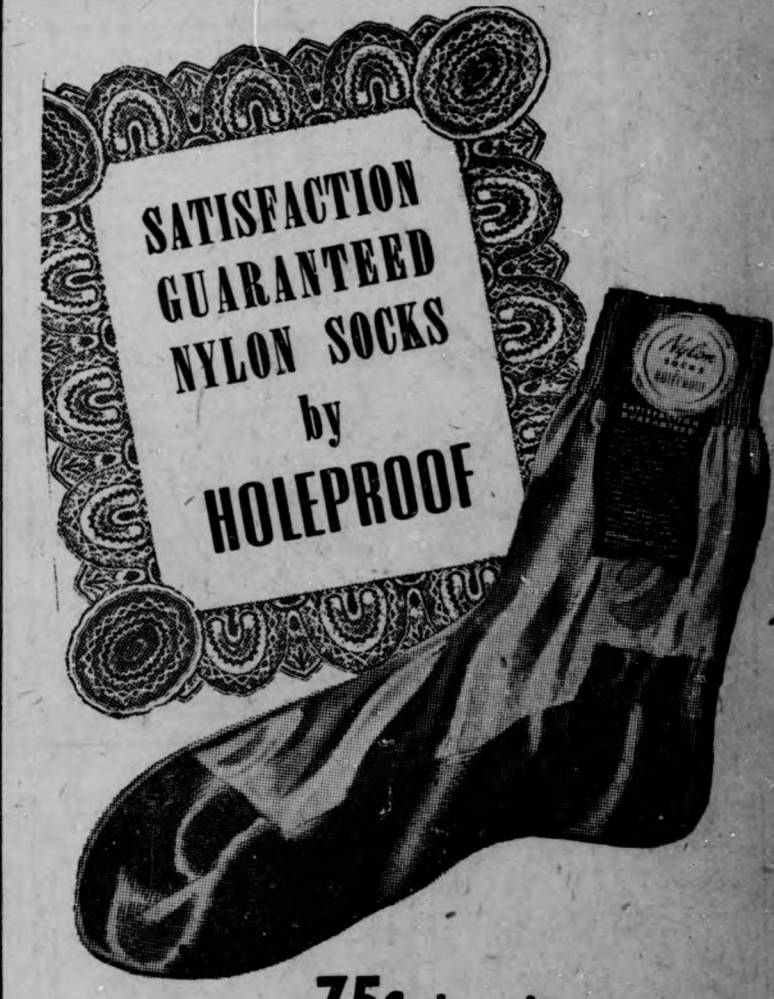
You are requested to call for your taxes by school districts in which the property is located.
